

**Be a Good Neighbor and Increase Safety! Maintain Your Landscaping in the Right of Way** 



## JOIN YOUR NEIGHBORS IN TAKING CARE OF OUR BEAUTIFUL SUQUAMISH COMMUNITY!

Did you know property owners are responsible for maintaining any vegetation located from their property to the roadway (area considered roadway right of way)? This includes vegetation growing onto sidewalks and into ditches. Maintenance involves watering, mulching, and keeping trees and shrubs pruned to increase site distance and safety. Also, it is important to keep ditches clear of yard debris to prevent flooding.

When the fronting property owner fails to adequately maintain their landscaping and safety is compromised, Kitsap County road maintenance crews will mow and prune the vegetation located in the right of way. Crews use equipment that is indiscriminate to plant types and shaping.
