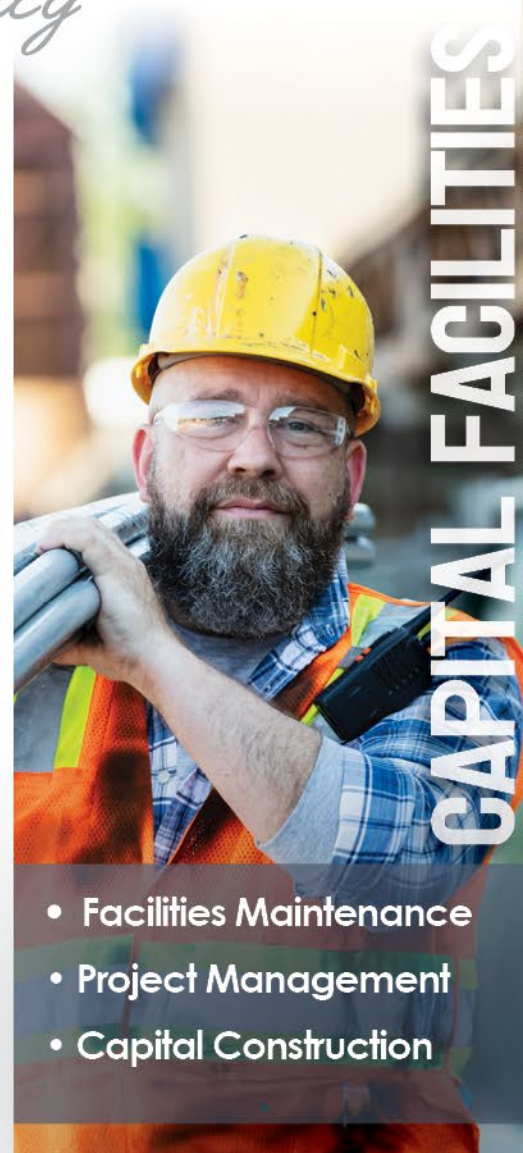

to address Pollutants

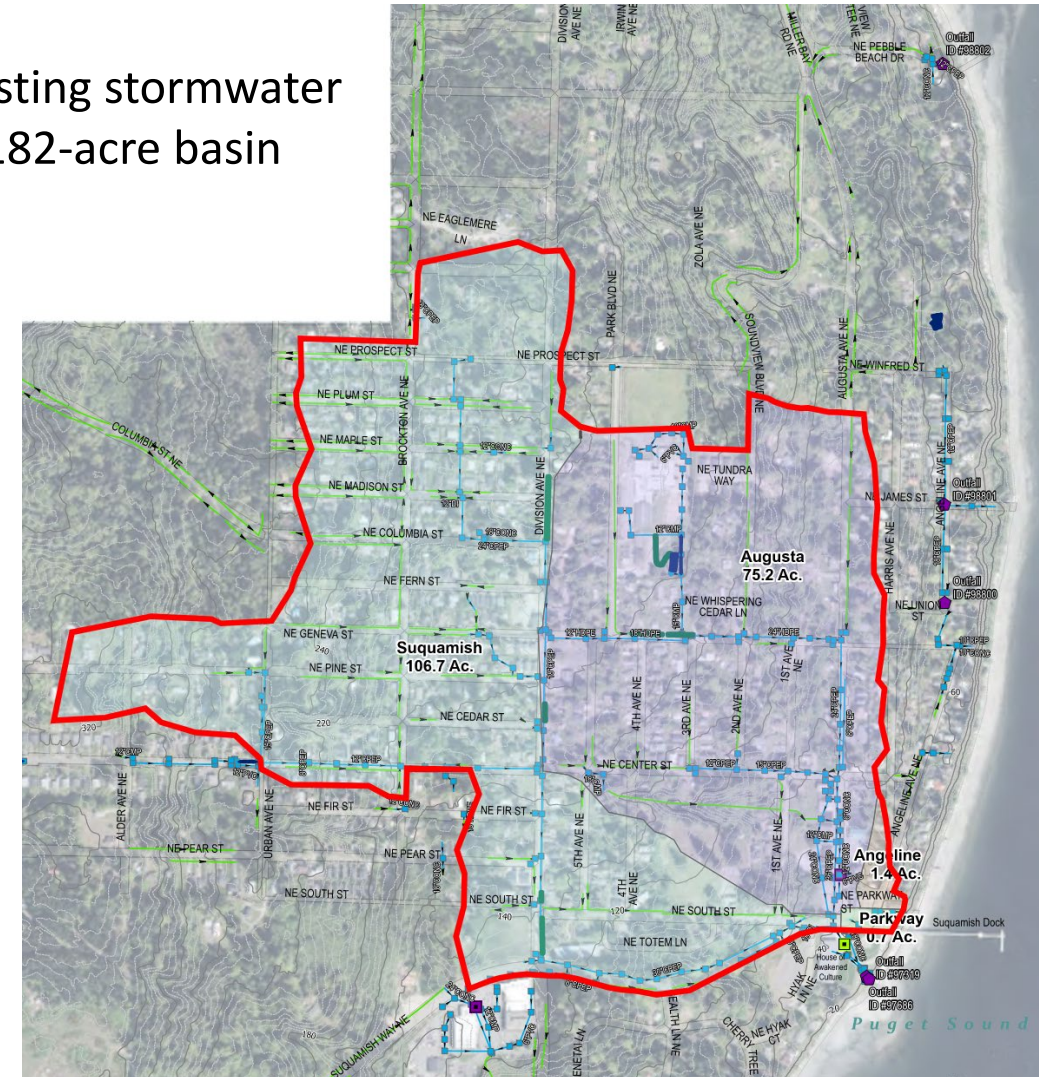
- Total Suspended Solids (TSS)

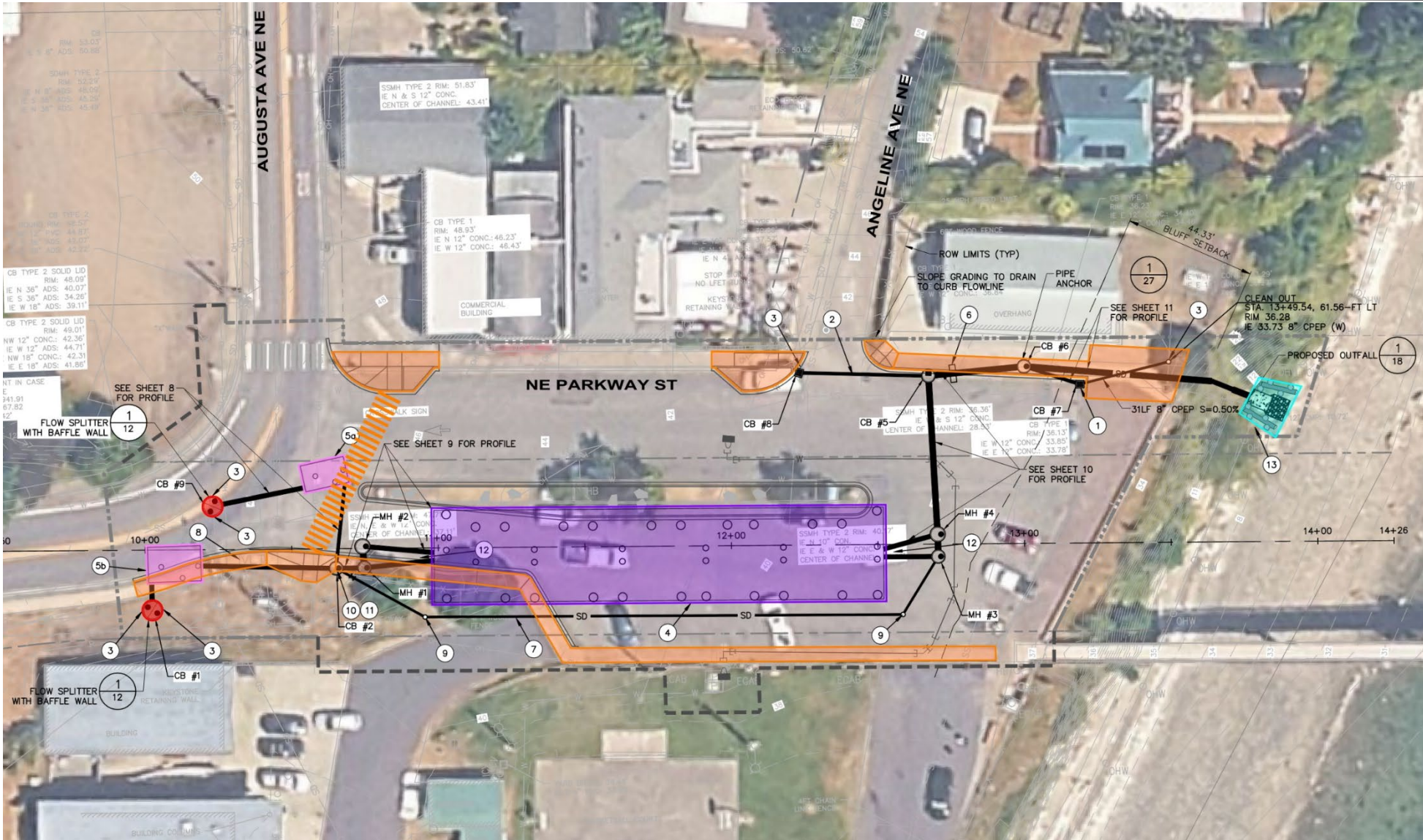

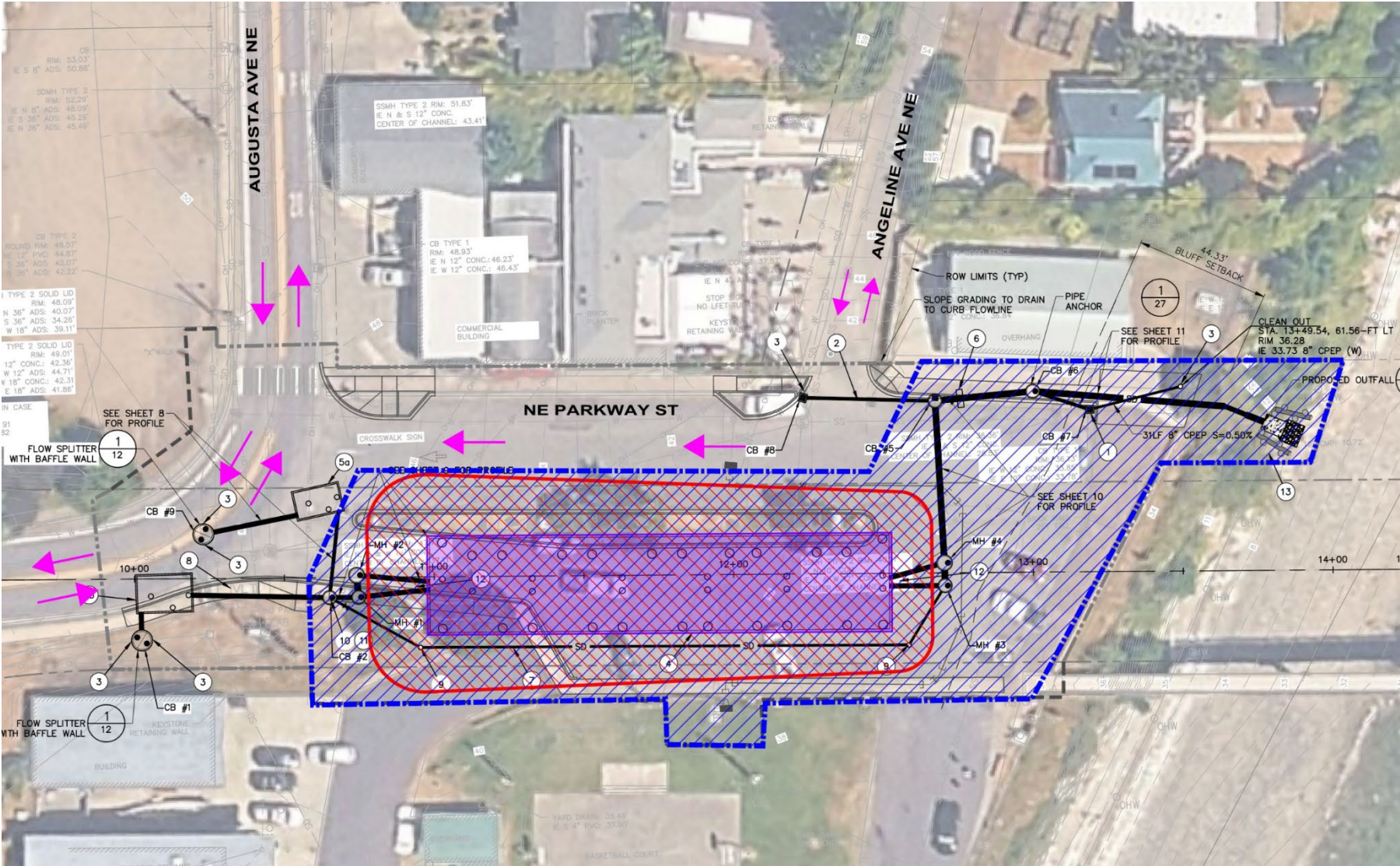

- Construction August 18 – March 20, 2026. (145 WD /~ 7-mo.)
