

About the Bucklin Tracyton Regional Stormwater Facility

Located at the corner of NW Bucklin Hill Road and Tracyton Boulevard in Silverdale, this facility will treat stormwater before it discharges into Dyes Inlet.

Goals: Improve water quality and provide community amenities.

The project total cost is estimated to be \$4.4 million, including design.

It is anticipated that construction would begin in 2026, **dependent on funding**.

A New Opportunity For Clean Water

- The Bucklin/Tracyton Regional Stormwater Facility will treat stormwater from 72.5 acres of commercial and residential development.
- Provides stormwater treatment before discharging into Dyes Inlet, an impaired waterbody.
- Creates a valuable community space for gathering and recreation.



What We're Working With

- Site is sloped from east to west.
- The park will serve as an accessible greenspace for nearby neighborhoods, the Central Kitsap community, and visitors.
- Site would treat a drainage basin of approximately 72.5 acres.
- Limited stormwater control and treatment in the drainage area.
