### **Initial Public Comments:**

- Mary Gleysteen reflected on the gun issues in America and whether it can happen here.
  - Commissioner Gelder indicated that the commissioners are looking at what's within their control.
- Joe Lubischer communicated three points.
  - The prior STO presentation left some with the impression that the decision had been made to route the STO thru the NK Heritage Park. This is unfortunate and inaccurate
  - I missed Joe's 2nd point
  - I missed the framing of point 3 but it seemed to relate to STO
    - When will it be open for public comment?
    - When will an information packet be available for those interested in commenting?
- Nancy Tietje spoke about the impact that the Arborwood development are having and the lack
  of planning. The poor infrastructure planning and the wildlife impacts the development is
  having.

    - April Ryan: re: the Seaside Townhome Project and why the UGA doesn't extend into the shopping district in the community. Arborwood conflicts with the stated concerns. Eric indicated that it was approved (as a vested project) pre-GMA days.
  - Kingston Sub-Area Plan (augments the Kingston plan)
    - County isn't looking to overhaul, but to Tweek. Goals, policies, facility updates, cod amendments.
    - Augments, not replaces, overall Comp Plan,
    - **2020-2024** 
      - 3,200 new residents

  - 4.5 years in Kitsap County focusing on self-sufficiency with a focus on transportation at
     ⅓ the price of an Uber or Cab in this region
  - Partners with Kitsap Long Term Aging & Care
  - Operating always, even during COVID
  - o G2G2 also helps provide free hot meals throughout the county on Thursdays
    - Pre-Covid they were cooking at the Salvation Army
    - Last year they joined the OSPI program providing low-income children with meals
  - Commissioner Gelder commented that G2G2 was a great partner during COVID
  - o New Offering: 4th Wednesday pancake breakfast at New Horizon Ministries
  - Every 4th Thursday hosting a free BBQ
  - Strives to avoid "pinballing" people around and instead "take the journey" with their clients. Continuum of care.
  - Provides eviction assistance
