We should be looking to see if permits are being requested to build on legacy lots (which are lots that are smaller than normal sized lots), and to see if there are any other permits or developments that are going to be built that don't require public notice.

This report was asked for by the MCAC because there is a disconnect between MCAC the planning department and DCD. It is the only way the MCAC can monitor, to ensure the Manchester Plan is being honored.
