### Guest Speaker Presentation: Rick LaGrandeur, Fire Chief at NK Fire and Rescue

- Protecting people and property
- Mission: prevention
- Average response time–under 7 minutes for emergencies
- All are both firefighters and EMTS. Volunteers are tender operators and chaplains
- Funding–EMS and Fire levies (property taxes)
- 60% of activities is emergency medical related. 2023 was the busiest year. 2024 on track to be busiest year yet.

- Build a kit to be self-sufficient. Be 2 weeks ready with food, water, and medicine. Smaller kits in your car or office
- Meet your street: <u>https://www.kitsapdem.com/meet-your-street-plan/</u>
- Wildfire: predicted to be a busy season. Preparing:
  - In general, we don't see extremes such as in CA or Eastern Wa
  - If you're burning outside, monitor it at all times. When you put it out, make sure it's cool to the touch
  - Monitor the burn ban status
  - Get a burn permit
  - Create a defensible space around your house. If there's a fire, the barrier should help stop spread
  - Request a home wildfire assessment
  - If something is on fire, call 911 AS SOON AS YOU CAN to help prevent more major events

  - Lets you enter the info you need the fire department to know if they're on their way to your home
  - Use to acquire a burn permit. Print a copy for your burn location

# Questions:

- 1. Who sets the burn ban and does it affect fireworks?
  - a. Burn ban put into effect by KC Fire Marshall. Affects all non-city area fire districts
  - b. Fireworks are not impacted by a burn ban–ongoing discussion among fire chiefs and the fire marshall. In our district, property and bodily damage has typically been pretty low.
    - Rolfes: Fire Marshall won't call a burn ban until the weather is drought conditions. Scientifically based. Fireworks could be banned. Fireworks are completely legal on tribal property. Banned on Bainbridge, Bremerton. Banned in the County except for July 4.
- 2. When a burn ban is not in effect, is a burn permit required?
  - a. For everything that isn't in a container 2 x 2
  - b. No penalty, except they'll put your fire out for you and show you how to get a permit

- 3. On South Kingston and Indianola, there was a Tsunami Evacuation sign put up. Do you know anything about that and what is our evacuation route?
  - a. Fire Chief didn't know, will follow up
- 4. Where does NK stand for EMS calls in our district—is 60% high or low? About in line with national averages
- 5. If there is a medical emergency, NKFD EMS will find a facility for you to receive emergency medical services, even if St. Michaels' is full

Audience questions:

- 1. Cliffside emergency preparedness strategy plan–working with PGS Tribe about their foresters and their assessment about what's happening is that they are seeing humidity go down a lot in the forests. Evacuation plans for folks who live north of 288. How do we get out of that area with only one way to egress?
  - a. Answer: no knowledge of efforts to build additional roads. You're right, north end of the peninsula would be completely cut off.
  - b. Notification strategy? Telling everyone at once could create a big problem. Could it be more strategic?
    - i. Rolfes: DEM was supposed to come up with a draft plan. Will bring the issue back to the county. Audience member will provide Alex with his info.
- 2. 72 homes down Country Woods Lane (south of Eglon past the Casino)–big forests in there with marshes that get dry in the summer. 4th of July neighbor set the marsh on fire, then set his roof on fire an hour later. Could you please advertise the fireworks ban?
  - a. Also, community meeting once per year. Could the Fire Department come talk to us?
    - i. Yes. He will give her his business card
  - b. Do you have a contact with other fire stations?
    - i. Yes. KC has an automatic aid agreement county-wide
