

Foreign Born Kitsap Residents (2018-2022)





Languages Spoken at Home in Kitsap from 2018-2022






North Kitsap - Between 1.3% and 2.6% in North Kitsap 2018-2022








 Free and Reduced-Price Meal Eligibility







- There has been no increasing or decreasing trend in Kitsap from 2010 to 2022.










Opioid Deaths



Fatal Opioid Overdoses per 100,000 population (age adjusted)




Fatal Opioid Overdoses per 100,000 population (2019-2023)


Fatal Opioid Overdoses per 100,000 population (2019-2023)

Nonfatal Opioid Overdose ED Visits per 100,000 Visits



Opioid Emergency Department Visits




Nonfatal Opioid Overdose ED Visits per 100,000 Visits (2019-2023)

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


