# **GUEST PRESENTATION:**

# Kitsap County Sheriff Gese (pronounced like Geessee)

Key Points:

- Chief Jeff Menge joined today's Zoom mtg with Sheriff Gese
- Sheriff Gese is new to the office replacing Sheriff Simpson.
- He has been with KCSO for 31 years.
- The presentation deck is very detailed (link to slides on KCAC website)
- 18 panelists, 18 attendees
- Kingston-specific:
  - Crime, traffic, homelessness, parking

Q&A:

- How do we report things like the racist graffiti at Carpenter Lake Preserve?
  - Please call 911. A deputy will follow-up.
  - It appears to be an isolated incident so far.
- Citizens on Patrol (COPs) question. Is there an advisory group? Wouldn't recruitment be more effective if the volunteer were allowed to serve either NK or their own community?
  - Managed by the Community Resource Officer (Schon Montague).
  - They are open to ideas.
  - They need to recruit new COP volunteers.
- How to support legislative changes re the police department:
  - Contact your representatives
- What can be done to enforce / prevent quads and other motorized bikes from unauthorized use of trails
  - That is really hard for KCSO to enforce.
- What if an individual is recording their illegal activity and sharing it on social media? Does that make it easier to enforce the law?
  - That might position KCSO to enforce. But there is also a time issue (whether the KCSO has the time to follow-up)

- In light of the January 6th insurrection, like all segments of society, law enforcement has people with fringe beliefs. Is KCSO allowed to do background checks that include social media screens? How will KCSO ensure they avoid hiring people with fringe beliefs?
  - Yes, this is included in background checks for new hires and during employment. Extensive screens including searching social media history as well as talking to neighbors of each individual is part of the first step in evaluating a candidate.

# Shaw Alire, Kingston Regional Stormwater Project Update

Key Points:

- Michelle Perdue and Tim Beachy, Kitsap County Public Works joined the presentation with Shawn Alire; also Phil Struck (consultant)
- The presentation deck is very detailed (link to slides on KCAC website)
- The service area is about 50 acres.
- Proposed spot on Ohio Ave. between Main St. and Central Ave.
- Complete Streets Study was used (completed ~2015)
- Summary
  - Intent of the project is to improve water quality
  - Support sustainable economic development
  - Construction expected to begin 2023
  - Available to connect in 2023
  - Future community updates will be available in later 2022 and 2023

- Will Kola Kole park also house the stormwater treatment system?
  - *No…we've moved on from that option*
- You were looking at the Port of Kingston...did it turn out to be too expensive?
  - The port location didn't work for both parties.
