- **Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe (Marla Powers)**
 - Presentation to the Port of Kingston happened recently re: the culvert injunction case. Marla is willing to present to other organizations.

- Tribal member Gena Steiner will be presenting to Kiwanis this month.
- Heronswood is hosting their spring plant sale coming up.
- Earth Day Celebration at the longhouse on April 22 (9-4PM)
- **Chamber of Commerce (Jen Skalbeck)**

 - Upcoming Events:

 - About 17% of their budget goes to international service projects which include Ukraine, Belize, Uganda, Mexico, and Afghanistan. Often these projects line up with emergency response needs.

Guest Presentation #1 – Commissioner's Office: County's Introduction of a Feasibility Study for Kingston Incorporation (Michaela Jellicoe, Community Attributes)

Member Comments/Questions:

- Glen - How does an incorporation petition begin?

- The report will address. It starts with a petition, then it goes to a vote.
- Shep - What is the tipping point for population? What made the small cities that were listed tip towards incorporation
 - Probably legacy towns. The minimum now is 1,500 (which is a limit that expires in 2028)
- Tim - It seems like it would be important to consider ferry traffic / impact so perhaps Coupeville would be a useful "comp".
- Steve - Is there going to be any discussion of the boundaries of the UGA?
 - Yes, they will consider economic drivers in the context of the UGA boundaries.
- Beth - suggested that LaConner could be a useful benchmark / comp.
- Patrick - consider other communities served by ferries
 - Kingston is kind of unique
- Steve - will you be exploring the levels of service? Not all dollars do the same thing. It would be helpful to understand different delivery models.
 - Scope and budget is somewhat limited with the budget they have for this study. For the comparison city they can look at those aspects
- Christine Rolfes - this study is being done based on a 2025 workplan because counties are required to provide UGAs information about incorporation. This is the first set of information that people need.

Public Comments and Questions:

- Fellow did a google search on what it takes to incorporate a city...He brought some info with him which is available on www.mrsc.org
 - She agreed that the MRSC is a very useful resource.
- Ron - incorporation has been a topic for decades. Many conclude that Kingston isn't economically ready yet. But there are things that can be done to move us forward. How much retail / retail tax is needed?
 - The report will not make recommendations about what Kingston should do but it will give us clarity of where we are now.
- Betsy - Services such as?
 - Not schools, not fire department
 - e.g., Sewer, water, surface water, roads, public safety (police, court)
- Ron - could you include a list of cities that incorporated in the last 20 years whose taxes did not increase?
 - 2001 / 2002 - Spokane Valley, Liberty Lake. Almost none since then.
- Dave - how many of these studies have you done? What are the lessons learned in general?
 - This is our 5th in the last few years. Usually there is an economic reason holding the town back but cities have the ability to right-size to get a better revenue / cost fit

Member Comments/Questions:

- Glen - what do you like most about Kingston?
 - Walkability, access to ferry, pretty
 - Ferry terminals, public transit supports trying new things
 - Wolfle, KMS, KHS - it's the people / students he's grown up with
 - Small size makes it intimate / connection, walkability
- Tim - Student body count?
 - 550 at KHS with more at Choice Academy
- Patrick - going away is so normal / expected, Speech / Debate?
 - Speech / Debate is now treated as a sport rather than a club. Recent change
- Tim - What is Kingston missing that we need?
 - Somewhat difficult to hangout without spending money. Library hours are pretty short.
 - More school spirit among Kingston residents (adults).
- Glen - traffic / safety concerns, what's the sentiment? Any suggestions?
 - There can be issues with ferry traffic coming into downtown which makes it harder to get to destination
 - Same. Especially trying to come out of a business lot and ferry traffic blocking the street.
- Glen - Walking safety?
 - Definitely feels somewhat unsafe
 - The Wolfle school zone from 45 to 25 isn't clear because of the curve. Would be better for the change to happen earlier.
- Patrick - do you feel like you have what you need for college applications?
 - AP teachers really help support standout essays. Scholarship support too.

Public Comments / Questions:

- Betsy - there used to be a science club
 - President of future health (medical is the focus but includes science)
- Betsy - arts & music have been curtailed or changed. Do you feel that?
 - Band was having a hard time because of shared need to middle school. Definitely could use more arts/music.
 - 2D Art would like to see it grow, Band starts super early (7AM)
- Breane - thank you!! Jobs came up. Are you working locally?
 - Worked at Henery Hardware in the summer. Took a while to find a job. Helped by his uncle.
 - Kingston Ale House, which is a first choice for a lot of students. Hours being flexible is not easy.
 - Had a hard time finding a job with enough flexibility with sports, etc.
 - Finding a job is difficult especially in the fall / winter.
- ??? - any vocational training? Especially non-computer
 - Personal finance, photography, yearbook, vocational
 - Similar to Running Start for technology / vocational training. e.g., welding
 - Trying to get a HomeEc club started to prepare for self-sufficiency

- Did you find a Tennis Coach?
 - Yes, he's currently coaching the boys team at Lake Washington.
- Hanging out. Gym at VGCC? Would that be used? Ping pong table?
 - Definitely. Tribal Center (but it's not local)
