



## New traffic signal and boarding pass dispensers coming for Kingston ferry commuters in spring

To improve traffic flow through Kingston and deter line cutting, a new signal and boarding pass dispensers were installed on SR 104 at Lindvog Road.

### How it works:

- Overhead signs at SR 104 and Barber Cutoff Road will indicate when the system is active.
- When active, ferry-bound traffic will follow the traffic signal into a designated lane.
- Drivers will stop at the boarding pass dispensers and take a pass.
- Drivers will wait for a green signal and then continue directly to the tollbooths.

WSF will begin testing this system from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on all Saturdays and Sundays in May and on Memorial Day, May 25. It will go into full use on Monday, June 1.

When active, all vehicles must have a pass when arriving at the tollbooth.

**Once full use begins on Monday, June 1, the system will operate daily from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on:**

- Mother's Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day, seven days a week
- Saturdays and Sundays year-round
- Seven days a week during Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.
