2 Ways to Report Speeding



The best way you can protect your neighborhood and share concerns about speeding is to report information to the county. Kitsap1 is available Monday - Friday, 8:00 AM to 4:30 AM by **phone: 360-337-5777, or Email:** help@kitsap1.com.

1. Report speeding via Kitsapl

Reports can be made by contacting **Kitsapl**. Whether emailing or calling Kitsapl to report speeding, you will be asked for the following information:

- Primary street name.
- Name of the cross street.
- Time of day this is occurring.
- Days of the week this is occurring.
- Is there a location where an officer can park to observe the speeders?
- Vehicle description, the address it belongs to, the license plate, or any other identifying marks that would help identify the vehicle.
- Can you identify the driver by name, where they live, or physical description?
- Are the individual commuters or kids going to/coming home from school?

2. Report speeding using the SeeClickFix portal

Visit the <u>SeeClickFix</u> Traffic Safety category and report a New Request. Select a location on the map (or enter an address, street name or intersection) and select **Confirm Location** at the bottom of the form to get started.
