
How to vote this ballot

Use dark blue or black ink to fill in the box to the left of your choice.




Mark **one** choice for a contest. If you mark more than one choice, no votes will be counted for that contest.

Advisory Vote No. 39

Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5974

The legislature increased, without a vote of the people, the tax on aircraft fuel from 11 cents to 18 cents per gallon, costing \$14 million in its first ten years, for government spending.

This tax increase should be:

Advisory Vote No. 40

Engrossed Substitute House Bill 2076

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, premiums on "transportation network companies" to provide workers compensation to their drivers, costing an indeterminate amount in its first ten years, for government spending.

This tax increase should be:

Kitsap County Fire Protection District No. 18 (Poulsbo Fire Department) Proposition No. 1	
Regular Property Tax Levy Lid Lift for Fire Protection & Emergency Medical Services	
<p>The Board of Commissioners of Kitsap County Fire Protection District No. 18 (Poulsbo Fire Department) adopted Resolution No. 22-05 (as amended on July 22, 2022) proposing an increase in the fire district's regular property tax levy. To fund fire protection and emergency medical services for six years, this proposition authorizes a maximum levy rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for collection in 2023 (and supersedes the lid lift currently in effect for collection years 2023 and 2024) and sets the limit factor for each subsequent year at 100% plus the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (as described in the Resolution) not to exceed 6%, or be less than 1%, whichever is greater. The final year's levy dollar amount would be used to compute limitations for subsequent levies.</p>

North Kitsap Fire and Rescue Proposition No. 1	
Regular Property Tax Levy Lid Lift for Fire Protection & Emergency Medical Services	
<p>The Board of Commissioners of North Kitsap Fire and Rescue adopted Resolution No. 2022-13 proposing an increase in the fire district's regular property tax levy. To fund fire protection and emergency medical services for six years, this proposition authorizes a maximum levy rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for collection in 2023 and authorizes annual adjustments for the five succeeding years based on the greater of the statutory 1% or the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index referenced in the Resolution, not to exceed 6%. The final year's levy dollar amount would be used to compute limitations for subsequent levies.</p>

South Kitsap Fire and Rescue Proposition No. 1	
Regular Property Tax Levy Lid Lift for Fire Protection & Emergency Medical Services	
<p>The Board of Commissioners of South Kitsap Fire and Rescue adopted Resolution No. 2022-07 proposing an increase in the fire district's regular property tax levy. To fund fire protection and emergency medical services for six years, this proposition authorizes a maximum levy rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for collection in 2023 (superseding the permanent lid lift currently in effect for that year) and sets the limit factor for each subsequent year at 100% plus the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (as described in the Resolution) or the amount authorized under RCW 84.55.0101, whichever is greater. The final year's levy dollar amount would be used to compute limitations for subsequent levies.</p>
