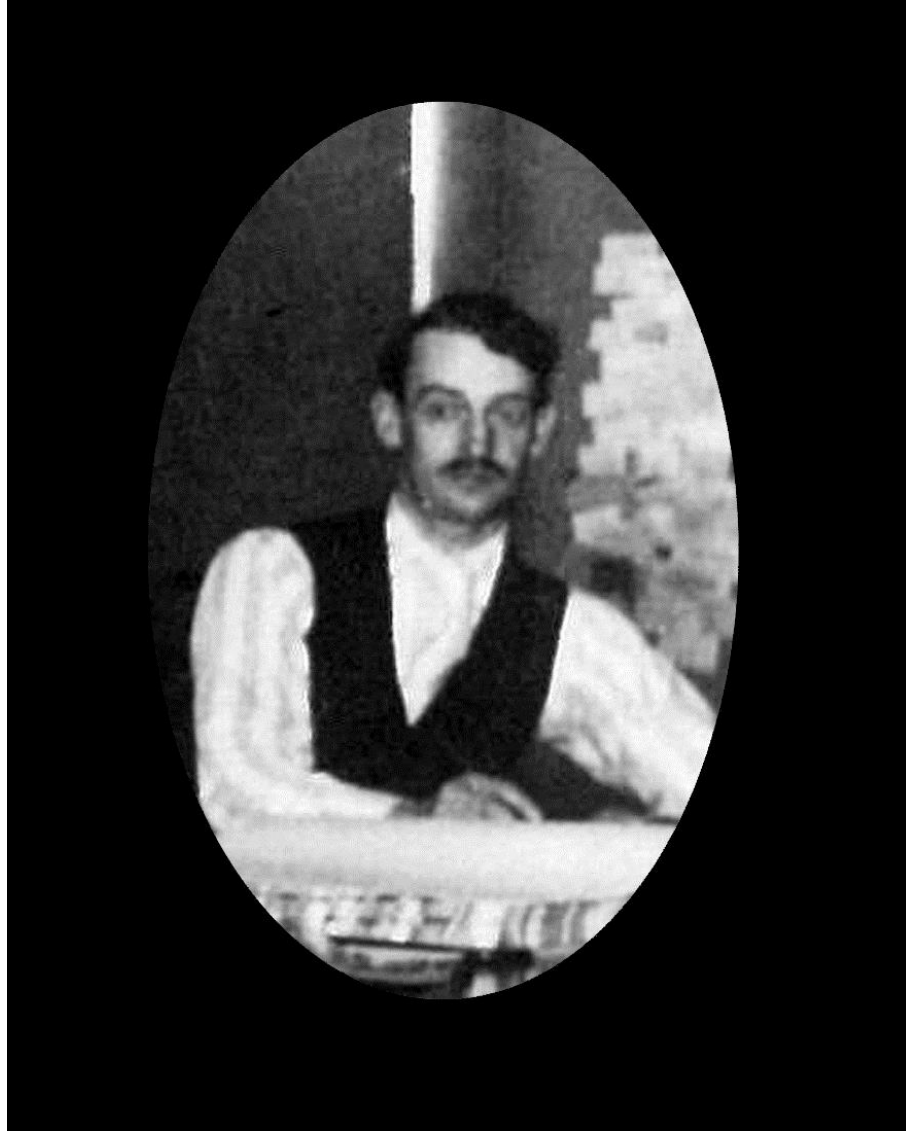


## William C. Newman

## W. C. NEWMAN, PROM- INENT PORT ORCHARD MAN, DEAD



W. C. Newman, prominent in civic and lodge affairs in Port Orchard for many years, died Monday afternoon at 1:35 at the Bremerton General hospital, after a lingering illness of several months. Death was caused from hemorrhagic meningitis. The widow, Mrs. Grace Newman and son, C. E. Newman, survive the departed friend.

Mr. Newman came to Port Orchard with his wife from Seattle in 1905. In 1910 and till 1914 he held office as county clerk of Kitsap county. Prior to that time and for several years, Mr. Newman was employed as deputy in the office of the county treasurer and the county clerk. He was elected as game warden in 1909 and held that office one term. In 1914 he took up the position as time-keeper to the dockmaster in the navy yard and has since held that position.

Deceased was a member of the Bremerton Elks lodge, the Port Orchard W. O. W. and the N. of W.

The last illness came after a long seige of sickness, but from which he apparently had nearly recovered. He seemed better than for several months and last week Friday morning he started on the ferry boat to the yard to resume his work. He collapsed when the boat neared the Bremerton dock, and was taken to the hospital where his death occurred never fully regaining consciousness.

The funeral services took place this morning at 10 o'clock from the Pendleton undertaking parlors and was under the auspices of the Elk's Lodge. The remains were taken by auto to Olympia where they were interred in the Masonic cemetery.
