

PLANNING

Guides comprehensive and area-wide planning and development regulation, reviews, conditions, approves and advises on land use and environmental development applications.



DEVELOPMENT ENGINEERING

Provides civil engineering permit review and approval for public and private site and infrastructure development proposals, and monitors construction sites for silt, erosion and stormwater controls.



BUILDING & FIRE SAFETY

Permits all types of construction, conducts periodic safety inspections of commercial uses, investigates origin, cause and circumstance of fires, provides disaster and emergency recovery, responsible for civil enforcement of applicable codes, and manages the Kitsap Nuisance Abatement Team.





Building Permit Activity & Action Plan

Residential Permitting

- 2025 budget projected a 6% decrease
- 2025 actuals (year to date, through August) is 16% less than 2024
- 2026 forecast includes a 4.3% increase over 2025 budget

Commercial Permitting

- 2025 budget projected a 16% decrease
- 2025 actuals (year to date, through August) is 28% less than 2024
- 2026 forecast includes a 2.5% increase over 2025 budget

Action Plan

- 2025 Special Revenue Fund director initiated hiring freeze implemented
 - Permit Technician
 - Construction Inspector 2
- · 2026 forecast includes positions as fully funded, however, permitting trends will be evaluated prior to filling any vacant positions.
