

# Kitsap County Sheriff's Office

### Accomplishments

- Added 2 certified patrol canines
- Jail HVAC upgrade completed
- Jail camera upgrade completed
- Jail Medicaid Waiver started July 1st
- New firearm transition
- Selected new Field Training Officers
- Added 3 part-time motorcycle positions
- Capital improvement of the Silverdale sergeant's office

- Performed 67 background investigations and hired 19 new Sheriff's Office employees
  - Delivered over 8,000 hours of agency training for deputies
    - > 5,616 of which were unfunded state mandates
- Attended 77 different community events
- Detectives responded to two homicide investigations, both cases ending in arrests
- Most detectives have received their Lead Certified Investigator status through CJTC

## KCSO Cuts & Adjustments



2026 Budget changes to meet \$1,741,976 BOCC requested net budget reductions.

- Position changes
- Positions eliminated
- ☐ Positions moved to grant funding
- ☐ Medicaid grant fund transfer
- ☐ Proposed bed rate increases

TOTAL BUDGET REDUCTION: \$1,668,757

\$74,797 (-.75 Support Svc, +Mid-year reclass)

\$768,582 (3 deputies, 3 corrections officers)

\$227,572 (2 corrections officers to Medicaid grant)

\$400,000 (from Medicaid grant)

\$346,953 (not yet proposed to the cities)
