A sustainable Earth supports our livelihoods, health, and happiness. A healthy planet is not an option - it is a necessity.




Species Spotlight: The Shimmy Worm

Also known as a Sandworm, this slithery-looking fellow inhabits sand or mud in marine intertidal and subtidal waters. They are speedy burrowers and evert their muscular proboscis to feed on other worms and crustaceans.

They are an opportunistic omnivorous feeder, snacking on anything they can find.
Sandworms are sensitive to water quality, making them an important indicator species within their specific habitats.
