## Non-Regulated Weed Updates

### CLASS C

- The addition of **Norway maple**, *Acer platanoides*
- The addition of **English or common holly**, *Ilex aquifolium*
- The addition of **black locust**, *Robinia pseudoacacia*

**No changes to Class B noxious weeds in Kitsap County at this time.**



### CLASS A

Noxious weeds that are very rare or not yet established in Washington. Because they pose a serious threat to the state, **eradication is required.**



### CLASS B

Noxious weeds that are present in Washington but are not widespread in every region of the state. In regions where they are still limited, control is required to stop them from spreading. In regions where they are already common, the local noxious weed board may require control.



### CLASS C

Noxious weeds that are widespread in Washington. Class C species may be designated for local control by the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board.



### WEEDS OF CONCERN

These species are not currently on the state noxious weed list but are a concern to the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board. Control and containment are encouraged.
