Longer periods of hot, dry weather in forests that have been historically overstocked may result in additional stress to trees, reducing their capacity to endure periods of drought, pests and pathogens, or survive wildfire. These changes could significantly alter forest structure and health, disrupt wildlife habitats, and increase the likelihood of large-scale tree die-offs, with cascading effects on ecosystems and biodiversity.
