21		Question/Discussion: Richard Shattuck asks about incentives regarding homeowners

23 24		<ul> <li>The rain garden incentive for a Single Family Residence (SFR) allows for a \$1,000 Cost Share or Incentive Payback.</li> </ul>
24 25		<ul> <li>The SFR fee is only \$91, so a 50% discount would be far less than the current</li> </ul>
26		Rain garden incentive program.
27		Question/Discussion: Any feedback from the Development Community
28		<ul> <li>Nothing negative. Simplifying rates will likely be beneficial to all</li> </ul>
29		Question/Discussion: Have any of the Public School Districts applied for or taken
30		advantage of these incentives?
31		<ul> <li>Yes, they must prove they provide educational curriculum teaching about</li> </ul>
32		water conservation and follow a verification process.
