


What's your connection to the Silverdale Center?

are not easy

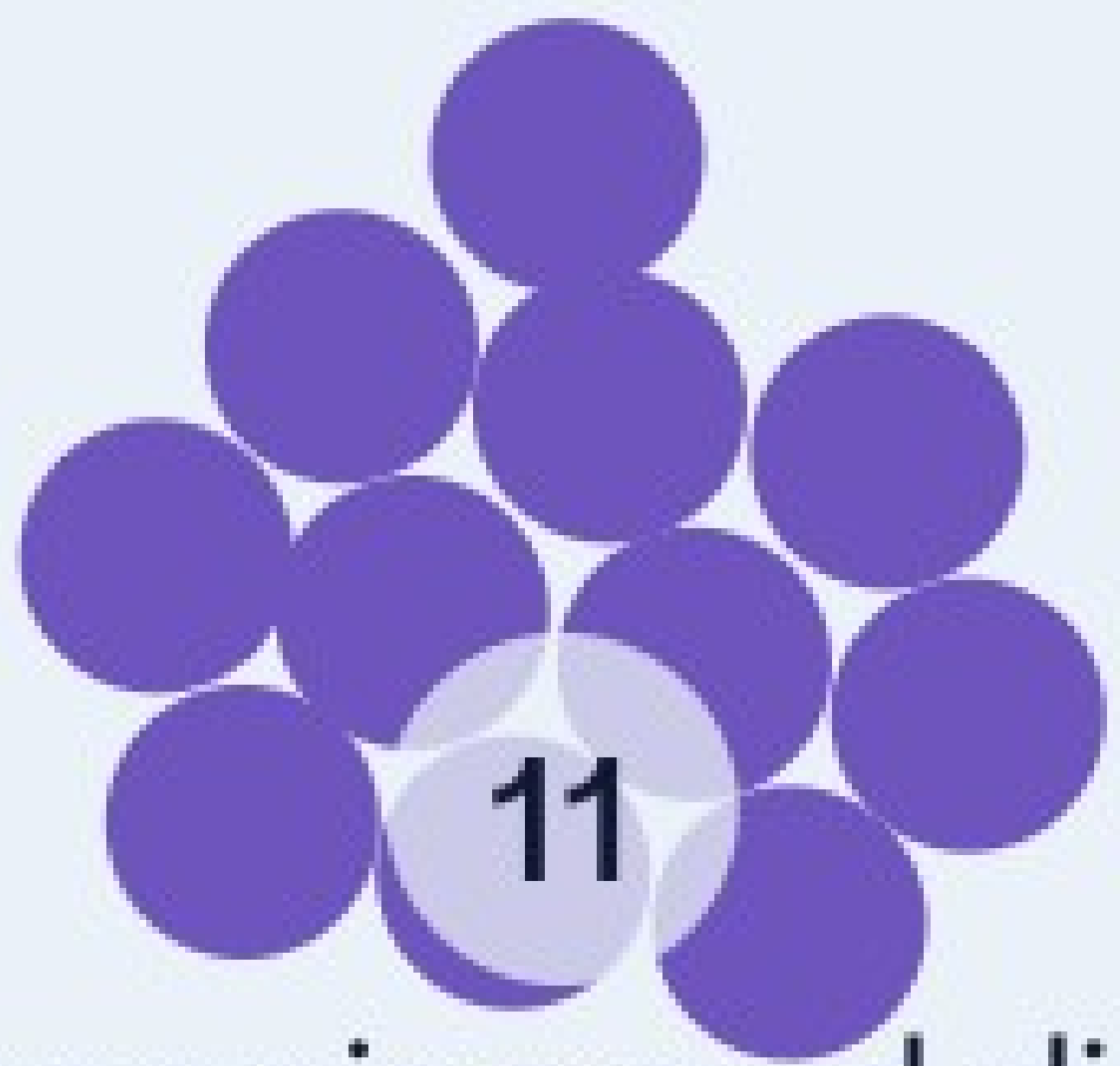
