Vessel Status Updates

- Comanche: Moved to Port Townsend
- Relief/New Guinea, Tollycraft: Under KSO authority
- Brownsville: Floating sailboat
- Dyes Inlet, Silverdale: Various vessels including deceased case
- Port of Brownsville: Two vessels staged for deconstruction

Focus Group & Program Updates

1. Public Resources

- FAQ published, new flyer printed
- Website updated
- Mobile pumpout service is active

2. Vessel Turn-In Program Event (Spring 2026)

- Pre-approval process with DNR
- Sign-ups: Dec 2025–Feb 2026; Event: Mar–May 2026
- Space confirmed at Port of Bremerton; ILA with Kitsap County required

3. Legislative & Enforcement

- Proposed update to derelict vessel definition
 - Aim: reduce ambiguity and seizure delays
 - Next: circulate language to TAC, coordinate with Rep. Greg Nance and County Commissioners

4. Tracking Database

- TAC reviewed and refined DNR field options for improved tracking

5. DNR Funding Update

- Received \$1.2M in current cycle
 - \$500K for tribal land removals (used DNR helicopters – saved cost)
 - Next biennium: ~\$16M available starting July 1
