

#### Additional Vessel Updates

  - 1 additional boat owned by same owner as Cardeis (Nora- large vessel, smaller than Cardeis)

# Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP) Event

- Finalizing inter-agency agreement with DNR
  - Disposal of up to 50 vessels
  - Vessels <35 feet</li>
  - \$200,000 budget
- Next step: Develop RFP for boatyard contractors
- Start advertising/sign ups December-February
  - DNR Approval required
- Event in March-May (approximately)

#### Legislative, Policy, & Enforcement


- Draft legislative proposal- outreach initiated to:
  - WA Public Ports Association Marinas Committee
  - Recreational Boaters Association of Washington
  - NW Indian Fisheries Commission
  - Kitsap County Commissioners
- Final call for TAC feedback

#### What is the problem?

- 1. Boats anchored on State-Owned Aquatic Lands that overstay, break anchor, and float away
- 2. Boats abandoned on private docks
- 3. Challenges determining vessel ownership& enforcing accountability

#### **Abandoned & Derelict Vessels:**

- Pose navigation hazards
- Impact public & private property
- Degrade water quality
- Impact aquatic habitats
- Impact fisheries
- Threaten public safety
- Result in costs to WA state taxpayers



#### Need identified by law enforcement focus group:

- The timeline to declare a vessel derelict is too long, allowing more time for vessels to break loose, become damaged, run aground, or sink
  - Once a vessel sinks, the cost of removal increases drastically



#### Currently...

Vessels with unknown or unlocatable owners must be declared "abandoned."

(1) "Abandoned vessel" means a vessel that has been left, moored, or anchored in the same area without the express consent, or contrary to the rules of, the owner, manager, or lessee of the aquatic lands below or on which the vessel is located for either a period of more than thirty consecutive days or for more than a total of ninety days in any three hundred sixty-five-day period, and the vessel's owner is: (a) Not known or cannot be located; or (b) known and located but is unwilling to take control of the vessel. For the purposes of this subsection (1) only, "in the same area" means within a radius of five miles of any location where the vessel was previously moored or anchored on aquatic lands.

Under current statute, a vessel with an unknown or unlocatable owner cannot be declared abandoned until it has been observed for 30 days (within 1 anchorage, within 5 miles). Then, the custody process can begin.

However, if a vessel meets the definition of "derelict," it can be declared derelict immediately if it meets the listed criteria. Then the custody process begins.

Custody process in 79.11.040 (no changes proposed to custody process)



# **Proposed Statute Change**

Therefore, this proposed change revises the definition of "derelict" to allow more vessels to fit that definition and thus prevent costly sinking of vessels by allowing the custody process to begin sooner.

#### RCW 79.100.010

- (5) "Derelict vessel" means the vessel's owner is known and can be located, and exerts control of a vessel that:
- (a) Has been moored, anchored, or otherwise left in the waters of the state or on public property contrary to RCW 79.02.300 or rules adopted by an authorized public entity; or
  - (b) Has been left on private property without authorization of the owner; or
  - (c) Has not been registered for a period of at least two years; or
  - (dc) Has been left for a period of seven consecutive days, and:
  - (i) Is sunk or in danger of sinking;
  - (ii) Is obstructing a waterway; or
  - (iii) Is endangering life or property.



#### Vessel Tracking Database

- Added data fields based on TAC feedback
- Imported structure and data from DNR
- Still finalizing data sharing agreement with DNR
- Next steps: Test/pilot database
