12/11/2024 Derelict Vessel Meeting Notes Summary

Kirvie opened the meeting with round table introductions and updates

Updates:

1. Vessel Removal Progress

- Kirvie provided updates:
 - Previously discussed finding a contractor for a sunken vessel.
 - Worked with DNR using State DES Contract #16122 (with Jerry's assistance).
 - Bid closes on December 13 at 4:30 PM.
 - Bid requests sent to all vendors in Category C.
 - Coordinated with WDFW and reached out regarding HPA (may require a new HPA or use a blanket HPA if bids meet criteria).

Adrift Vessel Report:

- Apple Tree Cove incident: DNR responded swiftly; Port of Kingston was highly cooperative.
- Kirvie seeks further details on contributors.

o Comments:

- Think about the resources we have private dock owners should have ease of addressing similar incidents.
- Coast Guard won't redirect boats to private docks without permission.
- Navy is required to follow the same rules as others.

2. Facility Verification Concerns

- Robyn's Question: Does verification occur before bringing a vessel to a facility?
- Suggested improvement: Notify 911 that you're the harbor master, and the boat doesn't belong there.
- Brittany to work with Kirvie on identifying challenges like these.
- A challenge identified was knowing the local conditions and ports. Such as is the facilities appropriate for the vessel.
- Need for a system to avoid future issues.

Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP)

- Brittany's Update:
 - Planning update shared; funding available through 2026.
 - VTIP is open year-round.
 - o DNR's VTIP flyer is available; can be shared broadly.
 - Suggestion: Use Kitsap webpage for promotion. Troy shared this is not required. Brittany will talk to Kirvie about this.
- Daria gave an update about the outreach she has begun; a follow up email will also be sent.

Comments and Feedback:

- Tammy: Asked about vessels (e.g., at Port of Brownsville) and if they'll still qualify for VTIP by 2026.
- Brittany: Vessels that qualify now can use the VTIP.
- Troy: Participation depends on vessel owners' willingness. Ports should identify vessels with interested owners.

Focus Groups

- Brittany shared updates:
 - Vision: Quarterly meetings for focus groups to report progress.
 - o Quarterly meetings will be in the same location unless decided otherwise.
 - Open to new members anytime.

Brittany shared a recap of the last six months and expressed gratitude for the group.
