Steps for Using KNRAMP Information in County Decision-Making

1	LOS Status Assessment	Identify the current levels of service (LOS) across the County.	
We are here 2	Advisory Group Discussion	Review the County-wide LOS status maps and identify areas and associated actions that KNRAMP will advance.	
3	Partner Engagement	Package County-wide LOS status with information on KNRAMP focus areas and actions and share with County departments and other organizations to inform priorities and investment decisions.	
4	Adaptive Management	Continue to monitor LOS status in selected and non-selected geographies.

 - **Goal for today's discussion:** Share 2-3 areas of interest across the County that need restoration and/or protection for each of the three KNRAMP assets: streams, forests, and shorelines.
 - **Intended outcome:** Identify overlaps in geographies of interest and understand why they should be addressed.
- **Reminders:**
 - Just because a geography is not part of KNRAMP's focus this year, it doesn't mean that we'll not focus on it in the next program phases; it also does not mean the County cannot address those areas outside of KNRAMP.
 - Identify areas for restoration and preservation.
 - Some evaluation considerations include:
 - **Benefits:** Assets and attributes impacted.
 - **Geography Context:** Area type - public vs. private, inside vs. outside UGAs.
 - **Risk and Urgency:** Areas at risk of degradation; areas with limited benefits.
 - **Opportunity:** Shared priorities, collaboration potential, and funding pathways.
