WHEN IS OPEN ENROLLMENT?

Open enrollment opens officially on **Saturday**, **November 1**, **2025** and ends **Saturday**, **November 15**, **2025**.

WHAT IS OPEN ENROLLMENT?

Open Enrollment gives all benefit eligible employees the opportunity to review, make changes, edit dependents or waive/cancel coverages to their benefit elections.

Open enrollment elections go into effect the following January 1, 2026. This is employees only time during the year to change their enrolled benefits, unless they experience a qualifying life event.

WHAT CAN YOU CHANGE?

- Enroll in or change your medical, dental or vision coverage
- Add or remove qualified dependents, including a spouse or state-registered domestic partner to/from your health plan
- Waive your medical coverage if you are covered by another employer-based group medical insurance
- Enroll or re-enroll in optional pre-tax savings programs such as Flexible Spending Arrangement (FSA)
 - **Must re-enroll into FSA benefits each Open Enrollment

2026 Eligibility Update - Medical Waiver

• Employees may not waive their individual medical coverage in lieu of coverage as a spouse/domestic partner on a Kitsap County-sponsored medical plan.

DEFERRED COMPENSATION PROGRAM

2026 Annual Contributions Limits Minimum Monthly \$30 or 1% of your earnings

Maximum Annually

\$24,500 (under age 50)

50+ Catch-Up \$32,500 (over age 50) **Special Catch-Up**

In addition to the max annual cap, employees may be eligible for an additional special catchup if nearing retirement under DRS

ROTH CATCH-UP: HIGH EARNERS

NEW in 2026: Employees who earn more than \$145,000 in the prior tax year, must make their 50+ Catch-Up contributions on a ROTH basis. They are allowed to contribute pre-tax or ROTH dollars up to the max annual cap but contributions for qualified Catch-Up will be required as ROTH post tax only.

Example: Up to \$24,500 can be pre-tax but Catch-Up funds (\$24,501 - \$32,500) will be required as ROTH contributions for those earning over \$145,000 annually

PRE-TAX

- DCP is tax-deferred it lowers your taxable income while you are working & it delays payments of income taxes on your investments until you withdraw your funds.
- DCP is an IRC Section 457 Plan administered by the Washington State Department of Retirement Systems.
- Taxes are withheld when you make withdrawals (cannot pull funds when actively employed with Kitsap County).

ROTH POST-TAX

- With the DCP Roth option, your contributions are deferred from your already taxed income.
- Roth withdrawals, including any investment earnings, are not taxed if you meet the minimum qualifications. These
 include a five-year holding period from the year of your first contribution and a minimum age of 59½. If you
 withdraw before meeting these, any investment earnings will be taxed.

TOTP MEDICAL CISA

Kitsap County offers High Deductible Health Plans paired with a Health Savings Account (HSA) under Aetna and Kaiser. The HSA is an individual health account that is owned by the employee and may be used for the payment of medical, dental and vision expenses that are not covered by their HDHP, including expenses that go towards satisfying the deductible. **HDHP plans can only be elected during Open Enrollment periods.**

Kitsap County will contribute \$1,350.00 for Employee Only or \$2,700.00 for Family into HSA

Individuals may contribute additional funds to their HSA on a pre-tax basis, up to an annual per person or family limit set by the IRS. The 2026 Contribution Limits for HSAs will be \$4,400 for employee only (\$3,050 max for employee contribution) or \$8,750 for family (\$6,050 max for employee contribution). An additional \$1,000 is allowed for those age 55 and older.

Employee HSA Contributions can be changed anytime during the year with a Workday Request

HEALTH CAREFSA



A Health Care Flexible Spending Account (FSA) allows employees to set aside pre-tax dollars from their paychecks to pay for eligible medical, dental or vision expenses. Employees determine an annual contribution which will be deducted evenly out of each paycheck on a pre-tax basis and put into the FSA account.

A Health Care FSA is pre-funded, which gives you access to your full annual election amount up front and you can use those pre-tax dollars to pay for eligible medical, dental and vision expenses.

The 2026 contribution limit for Health Care Flexible Spending Accounts is \$3,400. Remaining unspent Health Care FSA funds up to \$680, will carry over into 2027.



DEPENDENT GAREFSA

A Dependent Care FSA is a pre-tax benefit account that enables employees to set aside money to pay for their out-of-pocket daycare or dependent care expenses. You determine an annual contribution which will be deducted evenly out of each paycheck on a pre-tax basis and loaded to a debit card where funds are available after each contribution. Your Dependent Care FSA annual election amount cannot be changed after election (unless you experience a Qualified Life Event).

The 2026 contribution limit for Dependent Care FSA will be \$7,500 (there is no annual carryover for this FSA)

DON'T FORGET:

You must elect FSA every Open Enrollment

NEW in 2026: We are excited to announce new bundled Supplemental Life insurance with bonus Accidental Death & Dismemberment (AD&D). New enrollments are eligible for Guaranteed Issue for the following coverages:

> Employee: Coverage up to \$200,000 Spouse: Coverage up to \$50,000 Child(ren): Coverage up to \$10,000

LONG TERM DISABILITY BUY-UP

Kitsap County provides employees Base LTD at no cost. Employees can elect enhanced LTD coverage called Buy-Up LTD for an additional premium. Evidence of Insurability (EOI) is a requirement for new enrollment only, before benefit coverage is effective.

*LTD and STD benefits are not available to AFSCME 1308 Members

BASE LTD

Kitsap County provided Base LTD benefit

- 180-day (26 weeks) Waiting Period
- 40% of monthly earnings
- \$4,000 max monthly benefit

County Paid Benefit

> No EOI Required

BUY-UPLTD

Employees can elect an increase to their base LTD benefit

- 90-day (13 weeks) Waiting Period
- 60% of monthly earnings
- \$6,000 max monthly benefit





SHORT TERM DISABILITY 26 WEEKS

- 29-day Waiting Period
- 60% of monthly earnings
- \$1,000 max weekly benefit
- Maximum benefit period is 26 weeks

No EOI Required

SHORT TERM DISABILITY 13 WEEKS

- 29-day Waiting Period
- 60% of monthly earnings
- \$1,000 max weekly benefit
- Maximum benefit period is 13 weeks

No EOI Required

VOLUNTARY BENEFIT PLANS

VOYA also has 3 Voluntary Benefit plans. These plans don't replace your medical coverage; instead, they complement it. Benefit payments paid directly to you — to be used however you'd like.

ACCIDENT

Get benefit payments for specific events when a covered accident happens

CRITICAL ILLNESS

Get benefits for covered illnesses & conditions

> Get a daily benefit if you have an eligible stay in a covered facility
