

Specialized Services

Caring, committed professionals offer free, personalized consultations and help you find community resources.

Additionally, case managers help with....

- Creating a care plan that supports you
- Information about managing difficult behaviors
- Referral to counseling services
- Access to respite, basic medical equipment, nutrition support, and legal resources
- Individualized support

Caregiver Respite

What is respite?

A relaxing break for the caregiver while someone else temporarily assumes caregiving responsibilities.

Who is eligible for respite?

Unpaid adult caregivers residing in Kitsap County and providing care for an adult.

Who provides respite services?

- In-home care agencies
- Adult Day Care/Health Centers
- Short-term, facility-based care provider

What type of care is provided?

- Supportive and protective supervision
- Meal preparation and clean-up
- Hands-on personal care
- Assistance with daily living tasks
- Enrichment activities

What is the cost of respite?

Cost of respite care is determined confidentially, on a sliding fee scale, based on gross income.

Information and Education

- Access to a library of caregiver resources
- Limited financial assistance toward the cost of cargiving educational seminars or trainings
- Current list of support groups for a variety of medical conditions and caregiving situations
- Free presentations about our services to support groups and community organizations

Without support, caregivers tend to neglect their own health and well-being resulting in extreme stress, physical health problems, depression, and feelings of anger and anxiety.
