New Grant Proposal Summary

The Kitsap Rescue Mission serves approximately 275 unique individuals each year through our low-barrier, overnight/continuous stay shelter. Of those seeking refuge in the shelter, 39% report mental health issues while 13% report alcohol or drug use. The funding in the proposal would bring mental health and addiction recovery support on site for our homeless guests through Peninsula Community Health Services, with the goal of coordinating care and helping our guests stabilize while awaiting permanent housing.
