## **Accessible Communities Advisory Committee**

Tuesday, March 12, 2024

**1. MEETING:** Kris Colcock called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. Introductions were made.

### **2. REVIEW MEETING MINUTES:**

*MOTION: Amanda Gonzalez moved to approve the January 9, 2024; minutes with amendments. Ranae Beeker seconded. Motion carried.*

### **3. PRESENTATION: Anna Zivarts, Director of the Disability Mobility Initiative**

Anna Zivarts shared excitement about the Week Without Driving (WWD) campaign taking place from Monday September 30 – Sunday October 6, 2024. WWD was created in 2021 so policy makers, elected leaders and transportation professionals could begin to understand the barriers nondrivers experience in accessing our communities. 2023 WWD highlights included:

- 142 local organizations across 41 states and Washington D.C. and 10 national organizations organized and hosted.
- Over 300 elected and public officials from 30 states and Washington D.C. participated.
- Over 400 advocates and individuals from 41 states and Washington D.C. participated.
- 1,000+ social media posts, 500,000+ accounts reached, 12 national articles, and 90+ local publications.

Anna also shared that if anyone is interested in hosting a WWD challenge in your community. Anna provided a link to sign up [sign up here](#) to join the WWD monthly coalition meetings via Zoom. These webinars include:

- March 27, 2024, at 11 a.m. – How to organize an Inclusive Walk Roll Audit.
- April 24, 2024, at 11 a.m. – How Transit Agencies Are Using WWD.
- May 22, 2024, at 11 a.m. – How to Get an Official Proclamation for WWD from your City, County, or State.

### **4. ACTION ITEMS:**

#### **a. Approve advisory group work plan (attachment 2):**

*MOTION: Ranae Beeker moved to approve the 2024 ACAC Work Plan, with amendments. Amanda Gonzalez seconded. Motion carried.*

**b. Approve bylaws revisions (attachment 3):**

- The bylaws revision included that the ACAC Outreach Coordinator works at the pleasure of the chair.

*MOTION: Amanda Gonzalez moved to approve the bylaws revision, as presented. Molly Brooks seconded. Motion carried.*

**5. UPDATES:**

**a. Week Without Driving (WWD) campaign:**

- The Week Without Driving campaign takes place from September 30 – October 6, 2024. The WWD sub-committee consisting of Ranae, Amanda, and Jamin will be meeting in the coming weeks to discuss their plan further.

**b. City of Poulsbo Proposal for the accessible tricycles:**

- Kirsten announced that The City of Poulsbo has signed off, but the contract was pushed back during the initial March 11 commissioner meeting due to the incorrect pictures of the accessible tricycles being sent in. The confusion was cleared up and now the contract will be signed during the commissioners meeting on April 8.

**c. Sea Discovery Center accessible door project:**

- Kirsten shared that Kitsap County will contract with the Sea Discovery Center so they can oversee the project. The contract should be signed in April, with progress made by late spring, early summer.

**d. Governor's Committee on Disability Issues and Employment (GCDE) proposal to fund outreach activities:**

- Kirsten shared that the GCDE sent the contract in to Kitsap County on January 9, but was never received. Kirsten clarified that the contracts need to be turned into Kelly Oneal, prep is being done so the contract can be signed. Amanda has volunteered to store the ACAC supplies once they arrive.

**e. Olympic College Youth Rally:**

- On Tuesday, March 19, 2024, from 8a-1:20p high school students from across Kitsap County will gather for the Kitsap Youth Rally for Human Rights at Olympic College in Bremerton, sponsored by the Kitsap Safe Schools Network. This event is attended by junior and senior student clubs working for social justice and human rights. The ACAC will have a table at this event in hopes to better promote disability awareness and accessibility around Kitsap County. Ranae met with West Sound Academy World School Librarian Susan Trower to discuss workshops to take place during this event. ## **6. NEW BUSINESS:**

### **a. Staffing changes:**

- Sonya shared that in early 2022 Hannah Shockley was promoted and had to step away from her role with the ACAC. Taking over for Hannah, Kirsten Murray successfully led the ACAC through various projects and initiatives. As we move into 2024, Kirsten will be stepping aside from her role, and starting in April, Justin Wing will assume her position.
- Justin shared that he is excited for the opportunity to be the ACAC's advocate for more inclusive accessibility in Kitsap County.

## **7. ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

- Deborah shared that the North Sound to Olympics (NSTO) Trail Planning Feasibility Study draft has been published. The draft summarizes the Study's process, analysis, and preferred alignment for the NSTO between Kingston and Port Gamble Park. - Kris shared that establishing the Outdoors For All event sub-committee will take place during the April ACAC meeting.

### **a. Kitsap Public Health District Data Summit Highlights:**

- Ranae shared that she invited a number of groups, non-profits, and program managers to the September 2024 Data Summit, with a focus on mental health, health care accessibility, and housing and homelessness. More updates to come as the Summit gets closer.

## **8. DELEGATION OF TASKS / MOVING FORWARD:**

- Amanda shared that there will be a new date for the Week Without Driving sub-committee meeting, more details to come.
- Ranae shared information about the upcoming Annual Kitsap County Developmental Disabilities Resource Fair taking place on April 24, 2024, from 4p-6p at the Central High School Gym in Silverdale. A table needs to be staffed with two to three people during this event. Amanda, Molly, Ranae, and Kat will work together to form a plan. More details to follow during the April ACAC meeting.
- Ranae mentioned the upcoming Pacific Islander Festival in Marsha's absence. More details to come during the April ACAC meeting.
