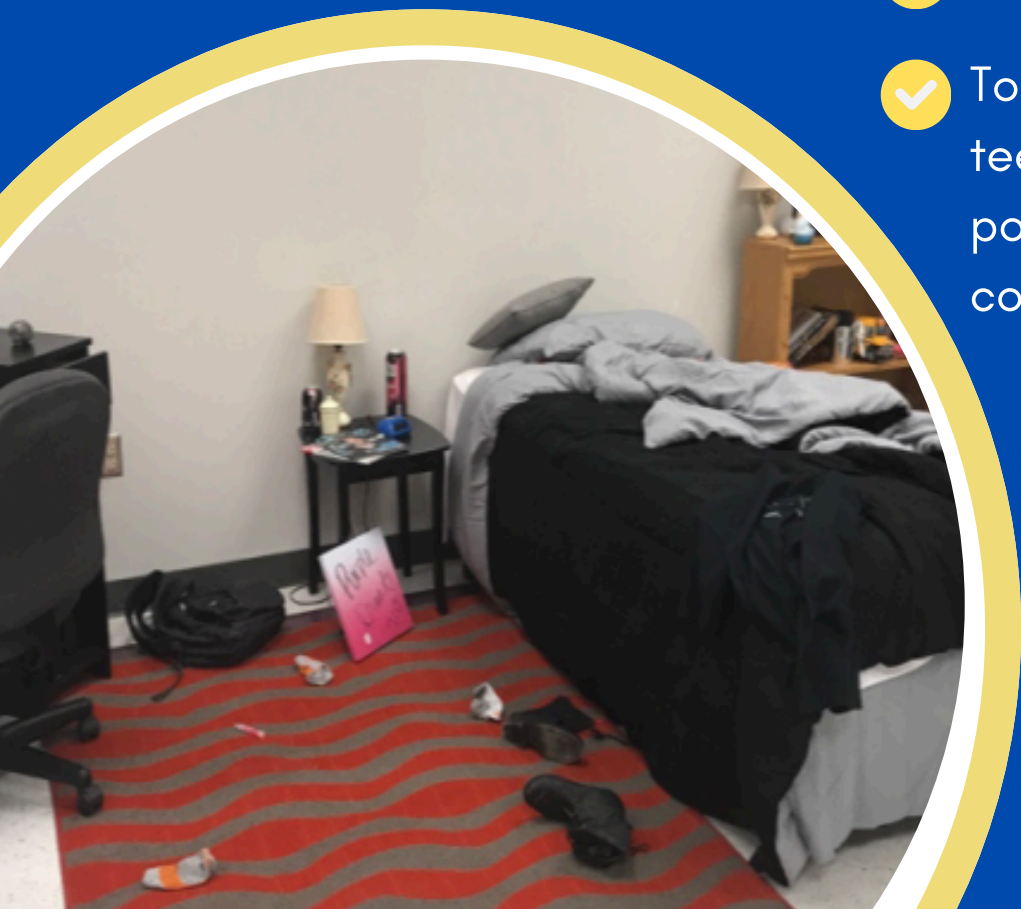

The theme for 2026 is 'Be Your Own Influencer.'

What's a Youth Rally? It's a gathering of students from all over the Kitsap Peninsula, with music and student-led workshops about social justice and human rights. The Rally is sponsored by Kitsap Safe Schools Network.

What will the schedule be at the Rally ? On-site check-in of registered student groups in the Bremer Center at Olympic College starts at 8 AM, the programming starts at 8:50 AM (with *three* breakout session *and* snacks), and the rally is over at 1:20 PM. The lunch period will be exclusively devoted to giving time for students to browse outreach tables from community organizations.

- **Gain leadership opportunities** by facilitating and conducting meetings, composing notes, and holding the group accountable to its purpose and community agreements.
- **Become more knowledgeable** and conscious about community issues and the larger factors that affect youth lives.
- **Provide a youth perspective** to the HearMeWA Program.
- **Represent the HearMeWA Youth Advisory Group** at events to create awareness about the program.

Youth between the ages of 10-25 who reside in Washington State can apply to be a member. Youth who are motivated and committed to learning and addressing issues related to youth, have a vision for the future, and are not afraid to voice their opinions in a respectful way are highly encouraged to apply.

Information youth provide during meetings and in this application could be subject to public records requests. Youth must have access to a smart phone or a computer for Zoom meetings.

The deadline to submit an application is the end of the day, January 2nd, 2026. Applications will be thoroughly reviewed and applicants can expect to hear about their submission by January 22nd, 2026.
