From the 2016 Kitsap Homeless Housing Plan:

Provide accountable community leadership (Strategy 5.1)

Leadership group: Establish a community leadership council on homelessness that includes participation at the executive level from a broad range of sectors including (but not limited to): elected officials, policy-makers, homeless service providers, behavioral health providers, medical providers, law enforcement, business-owners, emergency responders, planning, transit, education, youth providers, churches/faith-based organizations, and others. The purpose of the group would be to provide leadership on ending homelessness, improve cross-sector coordination, and devise and implement cross-sector strategies.

Increase availability of affordable housing (Strategy 1.3) Affordable Housing Task Force: Convene a task force to specifically identify and implement strategies to increase the availability and number of units of housing affordable to households earning 30% - 80% of area median income throughout Kitsap County


