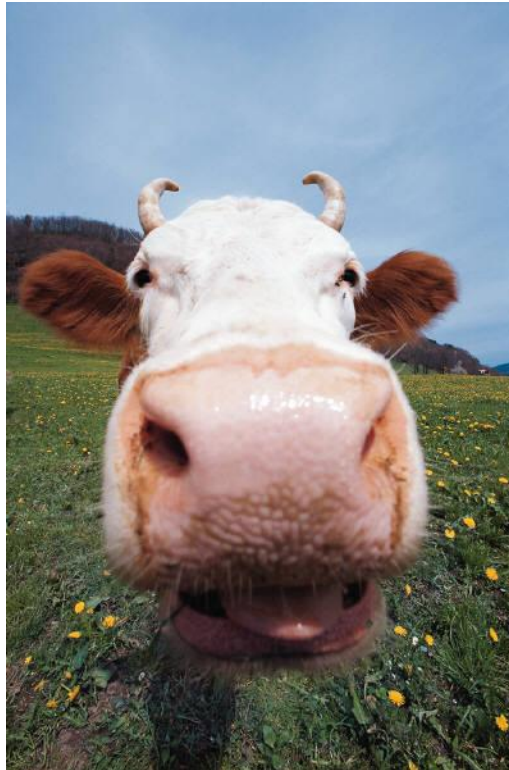

ENTRY FEES: Except as may be specifically defined in individual department rules, entry fees shall be a minimum fee of \$1.00 . Except as may be specifically defined in each special department rules, all livestock entries must be received by the Kitsap County Parks Office on or before July 15th. Entry fees must be paid at the time entries are submitted. All entry fee checks and/or money orders must be made payable to the Kitsap County Parks and dropped off at 1195 NW Fairgrounds Rd, Bremerton, WA 98311. 4-H and FFA exhibitors participating in Open Class competition must comply with all Open Class rules and regulations and only upon payment of entry fees.

ENTRY TIMES: All exhibits in livestock departments of the Kitsap County Fair will be entered the following times only:

- a. Tuesday of Fair week between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. subject, however, to complying with the health requirements and veterinary inspection requirements as set forth herein
- b. In all cases of livestock exhibits, the exhibits are to be in their assigned places in the livestock barns no later than 10:00 p.m., Tuesday of Fair week.
- c. ALL ANIMALS MUST BE VET CHECKED.

GENERAL RULES

1. All exhibitors in the Kitsap County Fair must comply with all rules and regulations as set forth by the Kitsap County Fair. Violation of any rules or regulations may be cause for disqualification of any exhibitor and may result in such exhibitor being removed from Kitsap County Fairgrounds and forfeit all premiums defined in General Rules.
2. Removal of any exhibit, prior to dismissal time, from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the exhibitor. Further, exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Kitsap County Fair.
3. EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY: Any person, regardless of place of residence, may enter all entries for livestock to be exhibited in the Kitsap County Fair. However, entries will be accepted from the Kitsap County area first, Kitsap Peninsula area second, with out-of-County third on a first come, first served basis, subject to space availability. Entry fee will be refunded if exhibit is not accepted due to space availability. If it is ascertained that an animal or exhibit is entered in a division or class in which it does not belong, the Superintendent may, at their discretion, correct the entry and place the animal or exhibit in the classification where it properly belongs and will so notify the entry clerk. No animal from any quarantined premises will be permitted to enter the Fair. Exhibitors are limited to two premiums per lot subject to space availability, however, may enter as many specimens as desired. Animals entered by different persons from the same address will be considered as one flock or herd.
4. ENTRY FEES: Except as may be specifically defined in individual department rules, entry fees shall be a minimum of \$1.00. Except as may be specifically defined in each special department rules, all livestock entries must be received by the Kitsap County Parks Office on or before **July 15th** at 1195 NW Fairgrounds Rd, Bremerton, WA 98311. Entry fees must be paid at the time entries are submitted. All entry fee checks and/or money orders must be made payable to the Kitsap County Parks. 4-H and FFA exhibitors participating in Open Class competition must comply with all Open Class rules and regulations and only upon payment of entry fees and be entered by the prescribed date.
5. ENTRY TIMES: All exhibits in livestock departments of the Kitsap County Fair will be entered the following times only:
 - a. Tuesday of Fair week between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. subject to, complying with the health requirements and veterinary inspection (except rabbits and poultry).
 - b. In all cases of livestock exhibits, the exhibits are to be in their assigned places in the livestock barns no later than 10:00 p.m., Tuesday of Fair week (except rabbits).
6. NO ANIMAL IS ALLOWED IN BARNs WITHOUT BEING VET CHECKED.
7. WITHDRAWAL TIMES: No livestock, tack, ribbons or personal belongings may be removed from exhibit area of the Fairgrounds prior to 5:00 p.m. for Open Class and 6:00 p.m. for all others on Sunday. Those exhibitors who are entered into another Fair on closing day of this Fair may be excused at the discretion of the Livestock Director or Assistant Livestock Director.
8. GOLF/UTILITY CARTS: No Golf Carts or Utility Carts are allowed anywhere on the Fairgrounds during Fair Without prior approval from a Fair Board Director or Fair Management. Approved carts must display approval credentials at all times. Any carts without credentials will be subject to immediately removed from the Fairgrounds.
9. The owner of an exhibit(s) releases the Kitsap County Fair and Kitsap County from any liability from loss, damage or injury to livestock, person(s) or property while such livestock exhibit(s) is/are on the Kitsap County Fairgrounds.
10. At no times shall there be any food or drink of any kind allowed in any kind in Kitsap County Fair livestock buildings to include the cat and dog buildings.
11. Any animal that requires behavioral modifying medication shall not be allowed on Kitsap County Fair Grounds.

HERDSMANSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The following requirements are compulsory for Herdsmanship in the Kitsap County Fair:

1. In all livestock departments of the Kitsap County Fair, all exhibits and stalls shall be kept constantly clean and no trash, rubbish, manure, used bedding or other debris shall be permitted to accumulate in or about any of the livestock area.
2. All youth exhibitors are expected to participate in Herdsmanship between the hours of 10am and 7pm. Adults shall be responsible for the remaining hours until the barns are closed for the evening (7pm until 10pm).
3. All livestock and animal exhibitors shall bear the responsibility of cleaning their own exhibit areas and placing all the trash, rubbish, manure, used bedding and other debris in some central place of their exhibit area in order for Fair personnel to pick up and dispose of such trash, rubbish, manure, bedding and any other debris.
4. 4-H and FFA members: Fitting of animals must be done by the 4-H or FFA member only, with minimal assistance from another 4-H or FFA member or 4-H Leader or FFA Advisor. Any other person fitting animals will be grounds for disqualification of exhibitor.
5. All competitors, at the conclusion of the Fair, shall pile all refuse, debris, manure and bedding in one central location of their exhibit area for Fair personnel to pick up and dispose of. The final compliance with this ruling by all competitors must be completed within 48 hours after the closing of the Fair.
6. Failure to comply with Herdsmanship requirements may result in the forfeiture of any premium that may be offered.
7. The merits of good Herdsmanship shall be as follows:
 - a. Educates and promotes the industry
 - b. Does the exhibit educate and provide an attractive presentation to draw people into the barn?
 - c. Is the information displayed or available that will provide the public with facts about the farm and breed(s) of animals on exhibit?
 - d. Does the display educate the public about the livestock industry?
 - e. In general, is the information provided informative, creative, and original, with a clearly defined theme?
 - f. Demonstrates pride in one's farm
 - g. Is there a farm sign present and clearly visible so a visitor can identify certain animals as belonging to a particular farm?
 - h. Is there information displayed or available that will provide the public with facts about the farm and the breed(s) being raised?
 - i. Are stall cards complete and in place?
 - j. General Attractiveness of Area: Has the Exhibitor made an effort to make his/her area attractive?
 - k. Are the public access aisles free of shavings and/or straw?
 - l. Are pens free of obvious fecal matter; water buckets free of straw and adequately filled; tack and equipment neatly stored; area generally uncluttered?
 - m. Are the animals clean and well groomed?
 - n. Exhibitor Appearance, Attitude, & Availability
 - o. Is the exhibitor neat, friendly, and available to answer questions?
 - p. Does the exhibitor respond to the public in a positive manner?



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HEALTH REQUIREMENTS AND VETERINARY INSPECTIONS OPEN CLASS, 4-H AND FFA LIVESTOCK

1. All Fairs are required to provide veterinary personnel for the purpose of examining all health certificates and to give visual inspection to all classes of livestock as is required. Authorized Fair Veterinarians will examine all livestock exhibits only during the hours of 10:00 a.m. – 9 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair week.
2. If a Fair veterinarian rules that an animal may not enter the Fair because of disease or any other reason, (s) he shall advise the official Fair Board Livestock Director or his/her assistant or the Fair Managers and, in turn, the Exhibitor shall be so advised and the animal shall be immediately removed from the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and shall not be allowed to return under any circumstances to the Kitsap County Fairgrounds during the current Fair. In all cases, the decisions of the Fair Veterinarian shall be final.
3. If any Exhibitor's livestock and/or animal become sick or diseased after they are in their exhibit areas of the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and veterinarian services are required, any veterinarian services that may be required and any monetary remuneration payable for the same shall be solely the responsibility of the Exhibitor and such expenses shall be borne by the Exhibitor. The exhibit in question may be sent home at the discretion of the Veterinarian and Fair Board Livestock Director.
4. Individual or herd health certificates and proof of vaccination are strongly recommended for entry. The Fair veterinarian shall issue a blanket health certificate covering all animal entries to the Fair.
5. No animal from quarantined area or premises will be permitted to enter the Fair/show.
6. All out-of-state animal entries must comply with State of Washington import regulations.
7. All out-of-state horses must have a negative Coggins test within six months.
8. Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry before they are exhibited, to determine that the livestock and poultry show no clinical indications of contagious, infectious disease and ectoparasites.
9. Fair veterinarian must and will reject any animal with infectious or contagious disease or ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be aware that ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks, fleas, abscesses and sore mouth fall into these categories.
10. Those animals exhibiting disease symptoms during the course of the Fair shall also be rejected by the Fair veterinarian.
11. It is strongly recommended that all animals be vaccinated in the current show year. It is recommended these vaccinations be given at least 4 weeks before Fair. The following vaccinations are recommended: Dogs Distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis yearly and rabies vaccination every two years Cats/Feline Distemper vaccination and rabies vaccination yearly Cattle A respiratory complex vaccine four weeks prior to Fair, Horses Tetanus toxoid, influenza, Eastern and Western Encephalomyelitis, a mixed bacterin injection are advised yearly.
12. Entry permits are required for all out-of-state animals.
13. All animals shall be provided with a adequate space in haul trailers. No over packed trailers will be allow and may be report to the Humane Society.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES

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2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
3. All exhibitors must sign a “National Show Ring Code of Ethics” and attach it to their livestock entry form. Form can be found at the end of the livestock exhibitors guide and on the fair web page, under exhibitor, than exhibitor forms.
4. Herdsmanship is required. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed with Open Class Livestock Rules. No Cash Award.
5. An entry fee of \$7.50 will be charged for each animal entered in this department. Entry forms with payment and National Show Ring Code of Ethics need to be in the Fair office by July 15th.
6. Substitutes may be made if done so prior to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday before Fair. Superintendent must approve substitutes.
7. Cattle are to be registered or registration applied for.
8. In group classes of the Cattle Department, all animals kept on the same farm and owned by different members of the same family will be considered as one exhibit and the family unit as one Exhibitor. Exhibitor is not required to be breeder of animals shown in group classes.
9. It is recommended that cattle have a respiratory complex vaccine at least four weeks prior to fair.
10. All Bulls over one (1) year of age must be shown with a nose lead.
11. All Cattle must be double tied while in stalls.

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3. All exhibitors must sign a “National Show Ring Code of Ethics” and attach it to their livestock entry form. Form can be found at the end of the livestock exhibitors guide and on the fair web page, under exhibitor, than exhibitor forms.
4. Herdsmanship is required. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed with Open Class Livestock Rules. No Cash Award.
5. An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged for each animal entered in this department. Entry forms with payment and National Show Ring Code of Ethics need to be in the Fair office by July 15th.
6. In accordance with state law, all goats will be checked for scrapie identification upon entry. No goats will be accepted without I.D.
7. ADGA, NPGA, and IBGA rules shall govern.
8. Only two (2) entries may be entered in each lot per exhibitor. The farm or family must be the registered owner of the animal being shown.
9. Superintendent may accept or limit entries as space permits to make an equally balanced show by breed.
10. Only those animals entered and shown in the Open Class division will be allowed in the Open Class area.
11. There will be a pre-show milk-out after 6:00 p.m.
12. Goats can only be shown in one Division.
13. White shirts are required for all exhibitors in show ring. Pants may be white, khaki or black.
14. No horned animals except on meat goats and horns must be capped. Exhibitors must have superintendent's approval.
15. There will be no tack or milking areas in barn unless space is available. All will share these.
16. Pack goats will cover multi-level obstacle course.
17. Cart goats will be expected to compete in harness.
18. Every exhibitor is responsible for providing education material for the general public.

5. An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged for each animal entered in this department. Entry forms with payment and National Show Ring Code of Ethics need to be in the Fair office by July 15th.
6. Age will be determined by teeth and registration papers (registration papers must be present at time of entry). Lambs shown by breeder do not need papers.
7. Animals must be registered; except lambs, which must be eligible for registry. Purchased lambs must be registered.

11. Breed classes will be judged according to their respective breed standards. Where there is only one exhibitor, the fleece(s) will be entered in Lot 14 or 15 as appropriate. If there is more than one exhibitor for a breed not listed, a Lot will be created.
12. Natural colored fleeces will be entered according to grade. If entered incorrectly, the Superintendent will have the authority to place it in the correct class. All natural colored entries will be judged as hand spinning fleeces.

The purpose of this activity is to promote the sheep industry by presenting an attractively modeled wool garment (at least 70%) with a well-groomed sheep in a manner to give spectators the opportunity to see wool in both its beautiful forms, on the hoof, and in the completed garment (not a costume).
2. Lads and Ladies Lead is a combined Open Class, 4-H and FFA event.
3. All exhibitors must comply with general rules and open class livestock rules and regulations as printed and approved by the Fair Board Directors of the Kitsap County Fair.
4. All exhibitors must sign a “National Show Ring Code of Ethics” and attach it to their livestock entry form. Form can be found at the end of the livestock exhibitors guide and on the fair web page, under exhibitor, than exhibitor forms.
5. No fee required to registered exhibitors.
6. Non registered contestants receive ribbon only.
7. Entry forms will be available on the information board next to Sheep Office in the Sheep barn and must be returned by 4:00 p.m. on event day.
8. Sheep must be ewe lambs, yearling ewes, or aged ewes and must be conditioned, fitted, and trained to show on a halter. The sheep must have been shown in her appropriate class in the Open Sheep Show, 4-H Show, or FFA Show and may be shown only once in the Lads and Ladies Lead Class. Only the participant will handle the sheep (Exception: Minimum assistance may be provided for participants age 6 and under).
9. Entries shall include a description of the garment to be worn, the background of the contestant, and the breed of sheep. This description will be read aloud as written while the contestant and his/her animal promenade the ring.
10. Entrants will be judged on the garment and its appearance, the appearance of the sheep, and the coordination in handling between the two. Remember, you are promoting wool and the sheep industry to the public.
11. A name sign may be attached to the exhibit, no larger than 12 x 18 inches.
12. Fair Staff will do the judging. There will also be a People’s Choice award. Vote for your favorite at the Horticulture Department in Presidents’ Hall.
13. The Fair Staff reserves the right to disqualify an entry deemed inappropriate for a family fair.

NATIONAL SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS

This code of ethics applies to anyone exhibiting animals at livestock shows in the United States. It includes juniors as well as Open Class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. All classes of livestock offered at the livestock event are included: Cattle (beef and dairy), Goats (angora, Boer, dairy, meats, cashmere), Equine (donkey, horses, and mules), Llamas and other specialty animals, poultry, rabbits, sheep, swine, and any other livestock classes offered. This "National Show Ring Code of Ethics" will be enhanced with additional rules and regulations which individual fairs and livestock shows impose on the local, county, state, regional, and national levels.

The following practices or procedures are unacceptable and are defined as being deceptive, fraudulent, unethical and inhumane in the care, fitting, preparation and showing of all classes of livestock. The use of any illegal drugs is prohibited. Legal or illegal substances used to phenotypically alter the appearance of an animal entered in livestock events is prohibited (see rule #4). Use of illegal drugs is considered a premeditated act! Furthermore, any information obtained on the practice of illegal alteration of an animal will be turned over to the proper authorities for criminal prosecuting. This is a ONE-STRIKE-AND-YOUR-OUT POLICY! Exhibitors will forfeit any premium, awards, or auction proceeds and will be prohibited from further competition at shows in the United States, as well as being subject to criminal prosecution if proven guilty.

The following is a listing of guidelines all exhibitors must follow to enter livestock at organized competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must have viable proof (junior division) of ownership available to prove length of time animals have been owned. Market Animals (beef, sheep, swine, and goats) must be owned and under exhibitor's daily care according to established rules and regulations for the Fair or livestock exposition. This also includes all small market animals (rabbits and poultry). The official ownership date is the date shown on the bill of sale, unless the animal was bred by the exhibitor, in which calving or birthing records must be shown (local rules may determine ownership requirements for non-market animals). Registered breeding livestock must show the exhibitor as the sole owner of the animal on the breed association papers or certificates.
2. No exhibitor may show an animal which has been previously sold at an auction or sale as a market animal through another fair, livestock show, whether or not there is an actual change of ownership (progressive level shows excluded). Any method used to misrepresent the age of an animal for a class in which it is shown is deceptive and considered illegal. Showing an animal for another individual by claiming ownership in order to show in a specific livestock class or event is prohibited. False ownership is illegal.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the Fair or livestock show (individual consideration will not be given in extenuating circumstances. Adults will not be allowed to physically assist in the preparation of the animal while at the show. Verbal instruction will be allowed, but no physical assistance is permitted. Physical assistance may be rendered by other junior-aged members in good standing in the 4-H and FFA programs. Any violation of this rule will result in immediate disqualification from the show.
4. Treating an animal internally or externally, with any irritant, counter-irritant, or other substances used to artificially change the conformation or appearance of an animal for show is considered unethical, inhumane, and is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to: the use of graphite powders, hemp, artificial hair coloring, common products such as fly spray, ointment or liniment used to the point that it is irritating (unless required to reduce edema at time of calving) or similar type products. The use of dyes, spray paint or other artificial coloring which result in altering an animal's true and natural appearance and/or color is prohibited. Adding false hair or hair-like, fleece or skin at any point, spot, or area of the animal's body is illegal and result in immediate disqualification. Any Liquid or substance not considered part of an accepted and normal diet for livestock is deemed illegal and inhumane. For example, the use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages as a drench or filler etc.
5. The use of tranquilizers, sedatives, or depressants which alter the physical or physiological state of the animal is illegal; Exceptions to this rule would be a licensed, certified veterinarian's treatment for a recognized disease or injury, or recommendation for tranquilizing breeding animals in heat that might compromise the safety of others. The drugs must be approved by the Food and Drug Administration for use in meat producing animals. All exhibitors shall advise show management of any drugs and/or medications administered to an animal that might be detected at the time of showing or at meat inspection. The name of the drug, its purpose, the person who administered the drug, time and date of administration shall be presented to show management prior to the showing and sale of the animal. Failure to report this information to the show management will result in severe penalty and/or disqualification. Any use of drugs or substances not approved by the Food and Drug Administration is strictly prohibited. All animals entered into livestock competition shall be subject to testing for foreign substances that exceed acceptable levels established by the FDA, FSIS, USDA, or EPA. During the livestock events, in the case of animals requiring treatment, all medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian and the livestock show officials shall be notified.
6. Surgery, injection, or insertion of foreign material under the skin and/or into the flesh of an animal to change the natural contour, conformation, or appearance of an animal's body is illegal. This includes vegetable oil, silicon, or any other substance used to alter the shape of the animal. Accepted practices of physical preparation which are allowed include, clipping of hair, trimming of hooves, dehorning, or removal of ancillary teats.
7. The balancing of the udder by abnormal means that includes the use of a mechanical contrivance or the injection of fluid or drugs, setting the teats, and/or occluding (sealing the ends) with a mechanical contrivance or with the use of a chemical preparation is illegal. Treating or massaging the udder or its attachments with an irritant or counter irritant is prohibited.

8. The use of inhumane fitting, showing and/or handling practices or devices shall not be tolerated, For example, breaking of tails, striking of the animal to cause swelling or for bracing purposes, use of an electrical contrivance, or use of overly severe bits is not accepted.
9. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive events is prohibited.
10. At the time an animal is sold at a auction at the livestock show, the exhibitor shall be held directly responsible for animals that are rejected at the processing center due to the presence of foreign residues. The seller may be liable to the buyer for an amount equal to three times the purchased price and may also be liable for attorney's fees and civil penalties. Show management may share acceptable intelligence and evidence information with FDA and USDA. If for any reason, any part of a meat animal must be removed by the FDA and USDA inspectors, the market price will be discounted.
11. Show management reserves the right to require animal health certificates. Health inspectors and diagnostic tests may be made before or after animals are on the livestock show premises for exhibitor and animal safety, or to inaugurate disease control procedures which may become necessary in emergencies as determined by animal health officials.

Any violation of "The National Show Ring Code of Ethics" or specific rules as designated by individual fairs and livestock shows will result in forfeiture of premiums and award, disqualification, and may result in probationary status and/or loss of eligibility for future participation in organized livestock competition.

Possible civil penalties may be imposed by the proper authorities, based on evidence provided by the livestock show, of exhibitors in violation of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act or the animal mistreatment, neglect, and abandonment laws that apply on the local state and national levels.

The decision of the livestock show management will be final.

Other cooperating shows (The International Association of Fairs and Expositions, The American Livestock Show & Rodeo Managers Association, and Western Fairs Assn.) will be notified of the action taken by the show management, which may affect the eligibility of the individual, group, or sponsoring organization for participation at the other shows who are also members of these organizations.

By making entry in a livestock show or event you are verifying you have read "The National Show Ring Code of Ethics" and understand the consequences of the penalties involved for illegal, unethical, inhumane, and unfair practices of competition. You also verify that you and your family may be prohibited from future participation in organized fairs and livestock shows in the United States, and could face penalties if implicated in any of the aforementioned acts.
