

Director's Report: June 17, 2026

ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM

Budget

Kitsap County is managing a structural budget deficit that is impacting all departments and operations that are funded by the County's General Fund. Kitsap County Parks was required to cut expenses by approximately \$348,000 for the 2026 operational budget, which was achieved predominantly by eliminating 2 full-time positions and all 5 summer seasonal positions. Thankfully, the summer seasonal positions were re-funded by means of a different budget source. For 2027, Parks was originally required to cut \$175,079, but based on updated mid-year expense figures, the gap has risen to \$440,961. At this time, it is unclear what level of cuts will be expected for Parks, but staff have already been identifying expense reductions so that a plan is ready once a cut target has been determined. The County Commissioners are investigating solutions and will be meeting at the end of the month to discuss how best to move forward. Also, the Kitsap County Department of Administration will be hosting 3 public community meetings to share this budget information. I highly encourage the Parks Advisory Board members to attend one of these meetings:

BoCC Sponsored Events

In 2025, the Board passed a resolution updating Commissioner Sponsored Events with associated fee waivers. The proposed resolution continues fee waivers for events held at the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and Events Center, including Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Veterans Day, Farm Days (formerly Corey’s Day on the Farm), Toys for Tots, and the Greater Kitsap Chamber Military Appreciation Day. The total estimated value of waived rental fees is \$50,000 annually, or \$10,000 per event, to be applied toward internal Kitsap County costs such as facility rentals, equipment rentals, and fire permit fees. *An update on the first three events in 2026 will be presented.*

Fall Athletic Field Rental Requests and Allocations

The Parks Department began accepting rental requests for the Fall 2026 field schedule (covering September, October, and November) on April 10. The request period closed on May 1. This year, the department received reservation requests from six different organizations.

Since the rental requests from the nine organizations exceeds the capacity of Parks’ fields, Parks staff have developed guidelines to assist with schedule development. The guidelines are designed to balance needs while supporting a diverse range of recreational opportunities, as well as to be as fair and equitable as possible. To accomplish this, the following is the priority in which rental requests are considered:

1. Kitsap County Parks Department co-sponsored programs
2. School District Programs
3. Non-Profit Organizations
4. Private For-Profit Leagues
5. Private Group, Events, and General Public
6. A one-time, non-profit event for members of a particular organization or group (i.e., company tournament).
7. Individual teams that do not meet the descriptions of prior categories.

In recognition that there are limited fields, the following additional factors may also be taken into consideration to help establish fair, equal, and reliable allocations.

- Benefit to the residents of Kitsap County



- Type of event (national, regional, state, or local)
- Seasonal activities versus non-seasonal activities
- Impact of use on the surrounding neighborhood
- Safety of participants and general Park facility visitors
- Scheduled games versus practices
- Diversity of recreational opportunities
- Field conditions (fields may be closed or subject to limited availability at any time for safety concerns or due to the risk of severe damage to the fields)
- Users in good standing (payments up to date following the applicable payment schedule and requests received according to the allocation timeline),
- Parking availability at the facility.

After evaluating the submitted requests, Parks staff determined that approximately 20% of the original fall field requests cannot be met. Please refer to *Attachment G* for details.

MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS PROGRAM

Park and Facility Maintenance

Throughout May, staff was spending the majority of their time performing routine cleanup, custodial in restrooms, servicing picnic shelters and trash cans, and general groundskeeping across the system according to their designated April 1 – Oct 1 service levels. Other M&O highlights include:

- **Cartegraph Enterprise Asset Management system onboarding:** M&O is making steady progress toward the July go-live of the County’s OpenGov (Cartegraph) asset management system. Over the past month, staff have continued onboarding priority assets and building out the preventative maintenance schedules and work activity templates that will support day-to-day operations once the system is active. A major emphasis has been close coordination with Public Works to ensure alignment on asset categories, utility information, and maintenance standards across departments. Because many infrastructure elements are jointly owned or jointly maintained, this collaboration helps clarify jurisdictional responsibilities and resolve long-standing gaps in tracking. As data is entered, the system is already surfacing assets that previously lacked clear ownership or consistent documentation. This work is laying the foundation for a unified, accurate asset inventory that will strengthen long-term stewardship, help preserve County assets, and support the implementation of consistent preventative maintenance routines.
- **Point No Point Septic:** The septic drainfield serving the Keeper’s Quarters duplex - home to both the rental unit and the U.S. Lighthouse Society office - has failed. To maintain uninterrupted operations, staff have arranged for the septic tank to be pumped approximately every two weeks as needed, until the new drainfield is online. Additional investigation was required before a replacement design could move forward, as Kitsap Public Health does not have complete historical records for this system. Staff are contracting with Drain Pros to design a new drainfield, and



an as-built record will be created and filed with Kitsap Public Health as part of this process. Construction costs will be determined once the design is complete.

- **Island Lake Community Center Septic:** Staff identified a significant leak at the Island Lake Park sewer lift station that caused the pumps to run continuously, ultimately burning out the primary pump. A crack was also discovered in the outflow pipe, which had been encased in concrete. The lift station is located within the aggregate sidewalk directly in front of the Community Center entryway, and repairs will require excavation and contracted concrete work to restore the area once the pipe is replaced. To complete these repairs and rebuild the pumps, the bathrooms at the Island Lake Community Center have been offline since May 8. Staff brought in an ADA portable toilet, a standard portable toilet, and a hand-washing station to support ongoing event rentals. The kitchen sink has remained available, which has required multiple tank pump-outs while funding and a purchase order were secured. The portable units are locked and reserved for event renters only, and all other public restrooms in the park remain open. Staff is working closely with the events team to minimize impacts to scheduled rentals. Work is currently underway and is expected to be completed by June 19, with a fiscal impact of approximately \$43,000.

Ballfield Maintenance

- **Chafer Beetle treatment:** Both Bloomquist Rotary Park and South Kitsap Regional Park were treated last week for the chafer beetle infestation that has destroyed the grass on Field 1. Staff has been able to preserve the turf on SKRP Fields 2 and 3, and has focused resources on maintaining those areas in playable condition.
- **Lobe 1 Backstop:** The metal posts in the concrete wall that comprise the backstop of Lobe 1 have started to shift causing the wall to crumble around the posts. Staff have contracted with a local construction company to install new posts and anchor them to the wall in uncompromised locations so that the net can be shifted and secured with stability to maintain this in this condition for another 10 years until the Lobe 1 backstop and seating can be improved in a future capital project.
- **Irrigation repairs and startup:** Staff have been starting up irrigation systems, identifying leaks and dialing in coverage.

Trail Maintenance

- **Trail Brushing:** The Point No Point Park upper trail was brushed, and staff is coordinating with volunteers at Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park to trim the roadways that have become overgrown and limiting site lines.
- **Tree Clearing:** Fallen trees were addressed at Howe Farm, South Kitsap Regional Park, North Kitsap Heritage Park, Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park, and Guillemot Cove Park.

Unplanned Maintenance: Vandalism and HEART Response

Throughout May staff responded to multiple incidents of vandalism, illegal dumping, and encampment cleanup across the park system:

- **Homeless Encampment Cleanups:** Staff completed cleanups at Illahee Preserve Heritage Park, Veterans Memorial Park, and Old Mill Park.
- **Illegal dumps:** Staff cleaned up illegal dumps at the Fairgrounds, Illahee Preserve Heritage Park, Anderson Hill Athletic Fields, and removed two abandoned RVs at Howe Farm and Horseshoe Lake Park.
- **Vandalism:** Graffiti was covered at the South Kitsap Regional Park restrooms and skatepark, Old Mill Park, and the Fairgrounds. The restroom building at Old Mill Park continues to be vandalized and broken into, damaging the hasp that was installed because the locking mechanisms had been vandalized previously. Calvinwood also had another break-in to the well house, cabins, and restroom building. Staff re-secured the openings. We are working with Information Services to get the mobile camera operational again so it may be deployed to trouble spots.

NATURAL RESOURCES PROGRAM

Trust Land Transfer Presentation

On May 27, in collaboration with Friends of Miller Bay, the proposed Gunderson Road 2027-2029 Trust Land Transfer was presented to the Washington Department of Natural Resources. The evaluation panel appreciated the through presentation and has follow up questions regarding how the site will be maintained, fire risk, and potential recreational access.

The Trust Land Transfer advisory committee is continuing to hear presentations on the 15 TLT proposals through the end of the month. They will then prioritize all proposals to the Board of Natural Resources for their review. The final approved prioritized list then is sent to the legislature for funding evaluation. Results from the prioritization process will be available in several months.

Wildlife Ecology Program Coordinator Hiring Update

A new member of the natural resource team will be joining Park on July 13th. This position will help grow the program to better encompass wildlife conservation and protection within Park lands.

Grant Application Update

The Listen Up Collaborative, a regional land management working group of which Kitsap County Parks is a member, re-applied this spring for the National Coastal Resilience Fund to support forest restoration work across many of the lands managed by members of the



collaborative. Unfortunately, the Listen Up Collaborative proposal was not selected to move forward this round. Feedback on the application has been requested.

Point No Point Lighthouse & Park Beaver Dam Notching

Beaver damn notching at Point No Point Lighthouse & Park has re-commenced for the summer. The midday low tides at this time of year allow staff to notch dams as the tide is falling and maximize drainage through the stormwater system before the dams are rebuilt. Notching will continue as we evaluate more efficient alternatives.

PLANNING PROGRAM

Planning

Gordon Park Master Plan

Parks staff and the consultant team concluded a successful initial phase of engagement for the Gordon Park Master Plan. The consultant team is now working on developing three draft design concepts, which will be shared for community review and feedback later this summer.

Park Impact Fee Study

Kitsap County Parks has completed the contract with Bowman Consulting Group to conduct a park impact fee study. Project kickoff will occur in June. Parks staff will bring this topic back to BoCC once more information is known.

Kola Kola Park Community Engagement

Parks engaged with the Kingston community around future use(s) for Kola Kola Park to help inform capital planning. A community survey was released on March 2nd and closed on March 31st. The survey received 330 responses. Following the results of the survey, Parks staff will evaluate an athletic field improvement project during the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) development process.

Rolling Hills Golf Course

Kitsap County Parks intends to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for operations of Rolling Hills Golf Course. Parks staff contracted with National Golf Foundation (NGF) for assistance with the development of the RFP. Per BoCC direction, the RFP will allow vendors to submit for an operating lease or a management agreement. Parks staff and NGF are currently working on a draft RFP, and staff will bring this topic back to the BoCC once more information is known.

Dan Thompson Grant

Parks is working with the Kitsap Public Health District on a parks and trails accessibility project funded by the Dan Thompson Grant. The overarching project includes improving the accessibility information for parks and trails, conducting an information campaign to publicize accessible parks and trails, developing a process to integrate accessibility into planning process, and carrying out accessibility improvement projects at parks within Kitsap County. The grant includes funding for these improvement projects, and Parks staff is working on developing a process to receive and evaluate project requests.

Capital Projects

Capital Improvement Plan

Parks staff is in the process of developing the draft Parks 2027-2032 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and intends to bring a draft CIP to the BoCC for review in July.

Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park – North Gateway Trailhead

Parks held a ribbon cutting ceremony on May 28th to celebrate the acquisitions of Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park, the development of the mountain bike ride park and the Stottlemeyer and North Gateway parking lots, and the completion of a forest restoration project.

Eagle’s Nest Deck Replacement

Construction is completed and Parks is awaiting a final inspection.

Gordon 1 Field Synthetic Turf Replacement

FieldTurf was awarded this project and will begin work mid-June. Construction is anticipated to be completed by June 31st.

Roof Replacement Projects

- Village Greens Golf Course Clubhouse: Asbestos testing will occur in June, construction is anticipated to happen in August.

HOURS BY SPORT JANUARY – MAY 2026



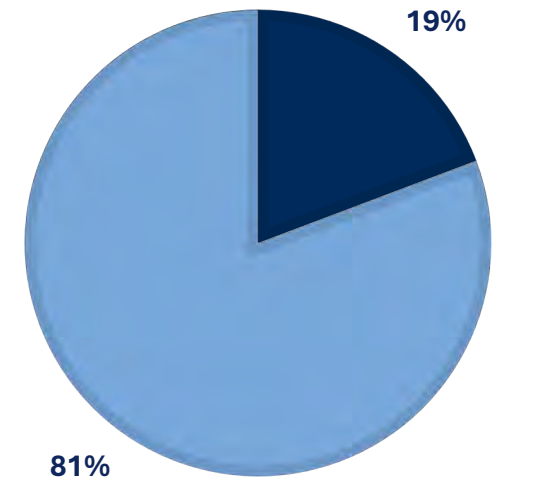

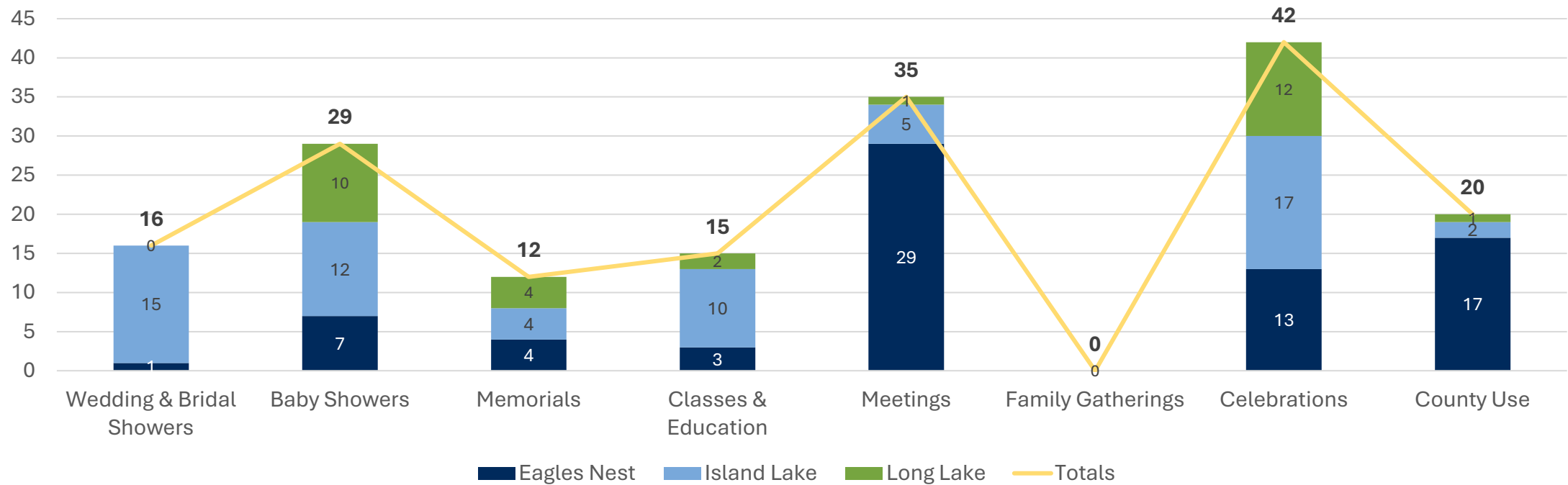

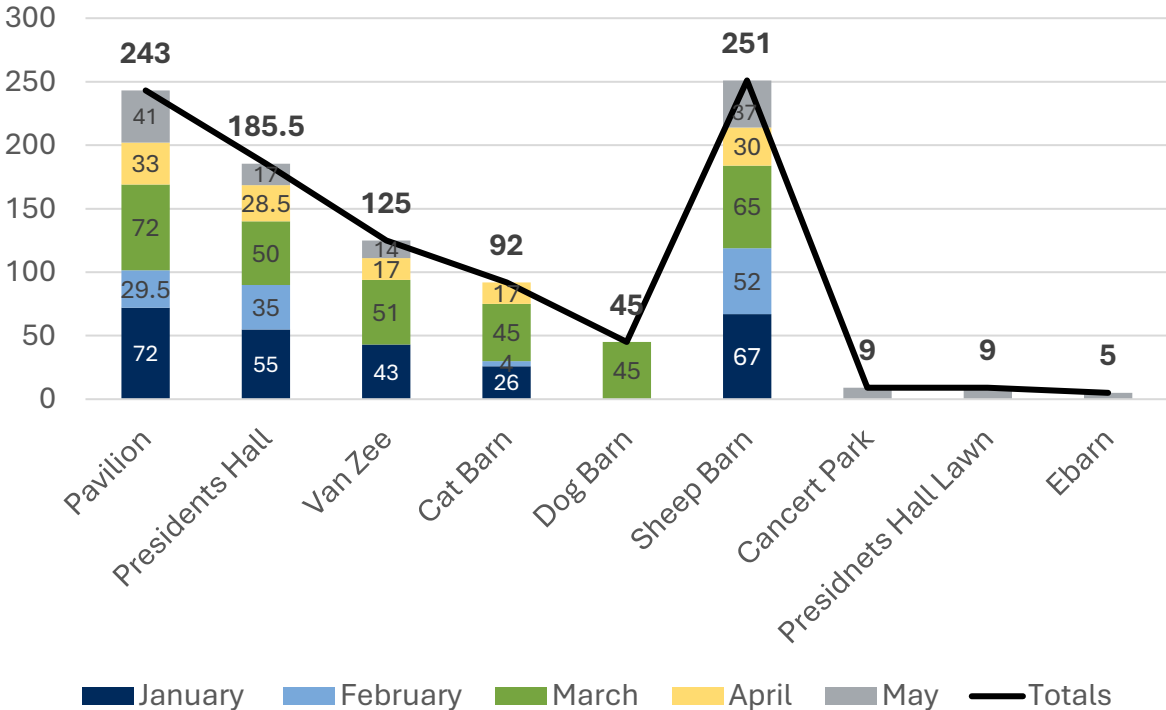

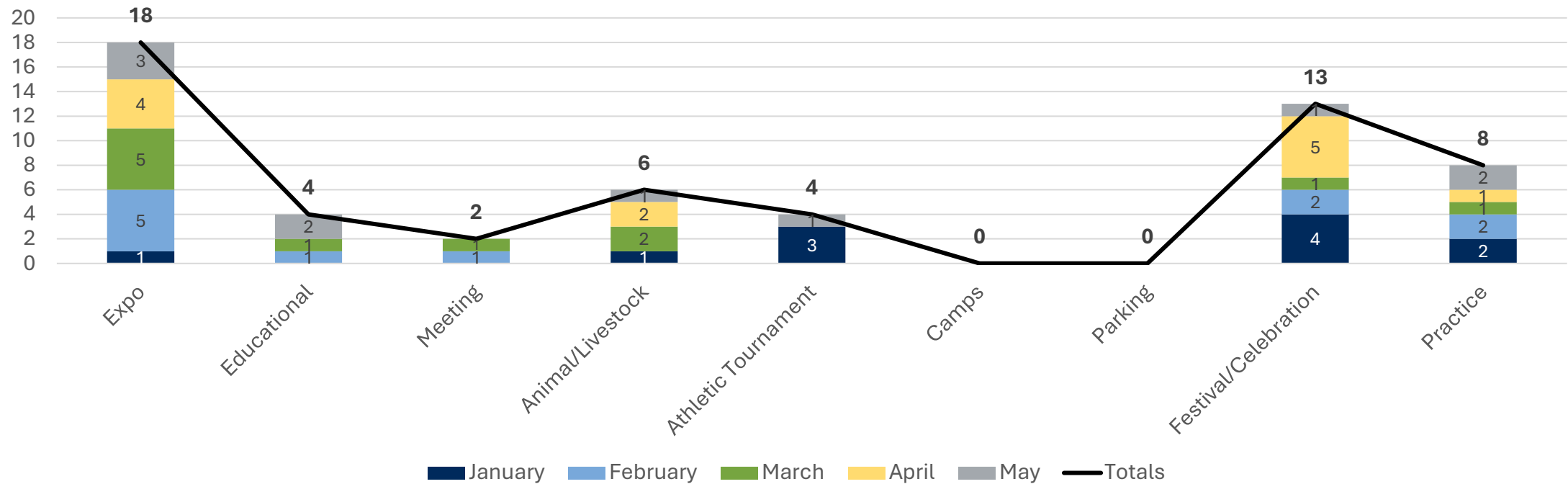
