KITSAP COUNTY PARKS ADVISORY BOARD DRAFT July 17, 2024 MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 PM by the Parks Advisory Board Chair, Larry Walker Guidelines of the hybrid Advisory Board Meeting were read.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

APPROVAL OF MINUTES | ACTION: Linda Berry-Maraist motioned to adopt <u>June 26, 2024</u>, meeting minutes. Amy Smalley seconded the motion. Minutes approved.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- Mara-Lousie Port Orchard resident. Thank you for Howe Farm Dog Park. This is an incredible
 resource for the community. Dog Park Inc.is under contract with Kitsap County for maintenance.
 Recent events have raised concerns regarding the personnel working for Dog Park Inc. There is a need
 for a better understanding of the Dog Park Inc's staff roles, authority and expected Code of Conduct.
 Proposes Parks Dept undertake a study of the issues raised and hold a Public meeting to solicit input
 from the public on the issues and a meeting to discuss how Dog Park Inc individuals are vested with
 authority, who they act on behalf of and what their powers are, to reduce misunderstanding.
 Parks Director is aware and looking into the situation. No details currently available.
- Beverly Parsons- Hansville resident.
 - Thanks for removing the draft Port Gamble Forest Master Plan from the Kitsap County Parks Department website. Four links in the text are not working.
 - Requests Parks post next steps for work related to Port Gamble Park. There appears to be confusion among various parties. Requests clarification on what are actual firm legal agreements with OPG/Radiant.
 - Requests to know if, when and how the Parks Advisory Board will have conversations about the implications of the County Commissioners selection of a Preferred Land Use Alternative.

- Staff Introduction Parks Director introduced new Parks Maintenance and Operations Supervisor, Bre Ganne.
- Parks Director provided a presentation on Parks Budget Structure and budget use details.
 PAB members discussed and asked questions about budget structure. Further discussion regarding Fee Structure policy changes.

 - PGFHP Stewardship subcommittee working on 2025 work plan with a focus on short term projects.
 - Restoration committee is moving forward with an Evan Stoll restoration demonstration garden project which is funded by the North Kitsap Trails Association

PUBLIC COMMENT -

- Joe Lubischer
 - Parks impact fees Due to the volume of Parks acquisitions maybe its time to change laws regarding impact fees. Parks will not receive impact fees from the one thousand units at Arborwood
 - Funding Natural Resources positions from the Forestry Program is inherently unstable. Who is paying the three Volunteer Coordinators
 Director explained that the three coordinators are funded through the general fund source.
 - Evergreen Huckleberry is the material harvested
 - Framework called out annual funding for basic forestry maintenance at Port Gamble. Is that funding being put into this Park?
 - Potential for mining the community and stewardship groups for support of Parks funding. Requires a more sophisticated understanding of the Stewardship groups. Suggests taking a closer look at how stewardships groups operate, how they can contribute and how they can manage.

Adjournment | **ACTION:** Linda Berry-Maraist moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy Smalley seconded the motion. Motioned carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:02PM.

Administration Program

2025 Budget Development

Following the County's Call to Budget letter that came out on July 8, Parks held individual meetings for each department program area to share the guidance received and initiate Parks' budget development process for fiscal year 2025. Over the past few years, Parks has created a system of processes and spreadsheets to assist staff and streamline the formation of Parks' proposed operational budget. The 2025 budget request has been submitted and complies with the direction provided - budget is to be status quo without new staffing. However, Park is requesting a few one-time expenses including:

- Wildlife Utilization Survey at Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park
- Vegetation Mapping Survey at Coulter Creek Heritage Park
- Washington Conservation Corps crews for trail and invasive weed maintenance
- System-Wide Sign Plan
- System-Wide Trails Plan
- o Mountain Bike Ride Park maintenance

Capital Projects Program

Point No Point Park Beach Rehabilitation

Permits for Phase 2 were submitted in May 2024 to the various regulatory agencies; these are the State of Washington's Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Ecology, US Army Corps of Engineers, US Coast Guard, and Kitsap County's Department of Community Development. Since permits have not yet been approved and the timeframe in which work can be performed within in the shoreline (Water Work Window, formerly referred to colloquially as the 'fish window') will end on October 15, project completion likely will not occur until 2025. Staff is meeting with Blue Coast Engineering on August 22 to discuss a new timeline and options about the possibility of modifying the construction schedule so the parking lot can open before the shoreline work is completed.

Eagle's Nest HVAC

Parks has contracted with Carrier to replace the old and failed HVAC units at the Eagle's Nest building at the Fairgrounds and Events Center that houses the Parks department offices and a rentable community space. The lead time is significant on the units and has been delayed by the factory 5 times already; September 16 is now the most current date of when the equipment is expected to be ready for shipping.

Pavilion Curtain Beam

The curtain beam repair work was completed in late July and has passed all inspections.

Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park – North Gateway Parking Lot

Parks and Public Works are working together to ensure the designs for the parking lot, entrance road, and Sound To Olympics trail are all in alignment with each other. The updated design for the parking lot, trailhead, entrance road, and Sound To Olympics trail is nearing 90% completion. Bidding and contracting are projected to happen in the winter and construction is anticipated to be completed by mid-2025.

Marketing and Events Program

Policy and Fee Schedule Update

Park staff are actively engaged in a comprehensive overhaul of its special event policy and fee structure, emphasizing incorporating guidelines tailored for Special Park Events that take place in parks other than the Fairgrounds and Events Center. The draft proposed changes to policy and fees are complete and currently under review by Parks' M&O staff. Following this, they will be shared with the Community Outreach & Visitor Services sub-committee of the Parks Advisory Board (PAB) in early September and then to the full PAB at the September 18 meeting.

Maintenance & Operations Program

<u>Fairgrounds</u>

The landscaping and grounds at the fairgrounds are in excellent condition and ready for the upcoming Kitsap Fair and Stampede event. Parks held an all-staff beautification day recently to perform tasks such as mowing, line trimming, hedging, tree trimming, and spreading beauty bark. Staff concluded the day with a BBQ lunch to boost morale and foster team spirit. Additionally, all buildings have passed all necessary fire and risk inspections in preparation for the event.

Vandalism and Theft

- Fairgrounds: Special Event equipment (electric cables, distribution boxes) was stolen out of the Pavilion on August 5; replacement cost for the items is approximately \$30,000, which Risk Management is funding. A Sherrif Detective Sergeant investigated the incident and staff have reengaged with IS to get cameras installed at the Fairgrounds and Events Center.
- Calvinwood: The lodge at Calvinwood experienced several break-ins recently. The occurrence of this vandalism has increased this summer compared to prior years. Staff has re-secured the building. The Sheriff's office has been notified and staff have asked for increased patrols in the area, however, they have limited capacity.
- **South Kitsap Regional Park**: There was a fire incident involving a large stump at the park. The fire department responded promptly, and the situation was contained without further damage.

HEART Team

The HEART Team has been actively addressing homeless encampments at Erlands Point and Illahee Preserve Heritage Park. We are working closely with the Sheriff's Deputy Wolner and Solid Waste teams to provide cleanup.

Adopt-A-Spot

Staff have been collaborating with Public Works' Solid Waste division to evolve the Adopt a Spot program in Parks. This initiative aims to engage the community in maintaining and beautifying our parks particularly in the heavily littered areas near park parking lots and high visitation sites such as our swimming lakes, skateparks and play areas.

Horseshoe Lake

 Algae Bloom Closure and Reopen: Horseshoe Lake was temporarily closed on July 18 due to cyanobacteria in the lake. While this occurrence is not uncommon, the full park closure is not the typical response. But in this case, Kitsap Health District recommended a full park closure to ensure access to the lake was closed because of reports of people getting sick from the water. After thorough testing and investigation into the illnesses by the Kitsap Health District, the lake was reopened to the public on August 2.

- **New Gate Installation**: Following vandalism to the fence from a vehicle, Horseshoe Lake will be getting a new park gate. The new gate will replace the large boulders previously used to block access during the closed season and improves the entrance to the park.
- **Tree Work**: Extensive tree work is needed at Horseshoe Lake to ensure the park remains safe for park visitors. Initial arborist estimates are over \$30,000 for work on 13 large trees.

Natural Resources Program

<u>Planning</u>

Staff are in the process of synthesizing past natural resource management information, identifying data gaps, and management needs within our park system. This effort will result in a systemwide natural resource management plan that includes an inventory and assessment of needs in the following subject areas:

- Vegetation
 - Forestry
 - Plant Communities
 - Special Status Species
 - o Invasive Species Management
- Wildlife
 - Habitat Utilization
 - Common Species
 - Special Status Species
- Aquatics
 - Freshwater Systems
 - o Shorelines
 - Wetlands

The systemwide strategy and plan will inform park level management and decisions as well as management at a landscape level. This effort is in preliminary phases and expected to continue into 2025.

Forestry

Planning continues. Policy and Implementation plans are being updated to include information on forest pests and pathogens within Kitsap County Parks.

Education and Outreach

Discover Kitsap Parks

July featured a walk at Coulter Creek Heritage Park on July 27th lead by Clay Antieau on the subject of native plants. We had 23 attendees who enjoyed learning about the plant world from this regional expert. On August 27th, there will be a walk at Illahee Preserve on the history of the park and its acquisition.



Parks staff finally received a draft copy of the PROS plan on August 2. Staff reviewed this draft and returned comments and edits to the consultant. The draft plan has some data gaps that need tending to and significant edits in some areas. Staff are hopeful the updated version will be ready for public review soon. Staff are working on an updated timeline with a goal of having it approved by the end of the year.








