Bahia Vista Slide Repair

Glenwood Road

Lake Helena Road to Wildwood Road resurface and paved shoulders

1.34 miles overlay and paved shoulders

• SR 104 Holding Lanes/ATMS

Kingston active traffic management system

- Reduced ferry traffic congestion within Kingston
- o 0.56 miles of reduced ferry traffic congestion/blockage within Kingston
- Improved access within Kingston



TIP Projects Completed in 2025

STO – Port Gamble Trail Segment D1

Construct gravel driveway and paved shared use path from park boundary to south end of parking lot

- 0.14 miles paved shared use path
- Park access road & parking lot

Silverdale Way Preservation Project


Overlay and ADA corrections: Silverdale Way – Waaga Way to Bucklin Hill and Bucklin Hill – Silverdale Way to Blaine

- 1.34 miles road repave, utility improvements
- 27 ADA ramps renovated

- 1. Annual process review
- 2. Develop candidate projects list
- 3. Candidate projects list evaluation
- 4. Revenue forecast and expenditures analysis
- 5. Selection of projects to advance to TIP
- 6. TIP review and adoption




2026-2031 TIP


- 33 projects
- \$110,330,000 6-year program

Goal: Deliver existing projects given projected revenue constraints and evolving grant and regulatory environment






TIP (6-Year) Revenue Shift 2016 to 2026



TIP (6-Year) Revenue Shift 2016 to 2026




- 95% of 2026 revenue is "restricted" and can only be used for a specific project or type of project
 - Impact Fees
 - StateGrants/Other
 - Federal Grants
- 33% of 2016 revenue was "restricted"

Levy/Gas Tax: 77% to 5%

Levy/Gas Tax

- \$5.2m supports 6 projects, matching \$13.3m in grant funding
- Minor support for 6 additional projects
- North Kitsap Service Center
- Only "unrestricted" revenue source available to TIP
- 2026 represents the last significant use of Levy/Gas tax use to support capital improvements






Shift - 2016 to 2026

Impact Fees: 0% to 10%

Transportation Impact Fees

- Full "local match" for 7 grants totaling \$33.3m
- Partial "local match" for 4 grants totaling \$11.5m
- PE for 2 future grant projects
- Only on-going revenue source to support capital improvements






Impact Fee Eligibility

- Significant fluctuations based on construction activities/economy
 - \$1.8m per year planning estimate
 - Restricted by district
 - Restricted to projects identified in Impact Fee Ordinance


Shift - 2016 to 2026

State Grants/Other: 10% to 29%

- REET II 2026 (\$2.4m)
 - Harper Estuary (\$1m, matching \$8.2m in grants)
 - Lund Harris to Chase (\$661k, matching \$3.1m in grants)
 - Lund & Chase (\$473k, matching \$2.3m grant)
 - Lund & Hoover (\$190k, supporting \$2.3m grant)
 - Lund Chase to Jackson 1 (\$51k, supporting \$3.8m grant)
- \$25.4m State/other grants
 - 7 grants awards
 - 3 unsecured

\$2.1m in SEPA Developer contributions

\$500k Stormwater






Federal Grants: 14% to 57%


Federal Grants


- 15 federal grant awards
 - Obligating grant awards may be problematic due to new federal requirements associated with executive orders
 - 3 grants (\$1.4m) are currently targeted by federal actions
 - Significant risks to County with federal changes to agreements post signature
- 7 unsecured grants
 - Risk of loss of future federal grant eligibility is significant






