# Required Disposal Appointment

## To Request An Appointment:



### 1. Complete online form

Visit [kcowa.us/bizhazwaste](https://kcowa.us/bizhazwaste) to complete an inventory form. Contact Kitsap1 at 360.337.5777 or [help@kitsap1.com](mailto:help@kitsap1.com) if you need help.



### 2. Schedule appointment

Program staff contacts you within five business days to schedule. Staff verifies materials meet acceptance criteria and may request Safety Data Sheets (SDS).



### 3. Deliver your waste safely

*We do not accept items or amounts not included on your inventory form.* Prepare for your appointment.

- Keep waste types separate. Do not mix.
- Label and transport waste in closed, leak-proof containers.
- Secure waste in trunk or truck bed to minimize risk to people.
- Comply with U.S. Department of Transportation regulations for hauling hazardous materials (see [phmsa.dot.gov/hazmat](https://phmsa.dot.gov/hazmat) for more information)



### 4. Pay disposal fees

Pay by local check at time of visit or receive an invoice by mail. Fees vary by waste type and quantity. See a sample price list at [kcowa.us/bizhazwaste](https://kcowa.us/bizhazwaste).

# What is the Kitsap County Small Quantity Generator (SQG) Program ?

The program helps qualifying businesses and organizations follow dangerous waste regulations. It offers affordable disposal appointments and optional site visits.

## Who can use this program?

Businesses or organizations (including churches, schools, and nonprofits) that generate:

- Less than 220 pounds of dangerous waste in any month (equivalent to roughly 25 gallons of typical liquid waste), or
- Less than 2.2 pounds of certain kinds of highly toxic waste in any month, or
- Accumulate less than 2200 pounds of dangerous waste on site at any time.

Refer to Washington Department of Ecology regulations WAC 173-303 for definitions of Small Quantity Generator and dangerous waste.

## What is dangerous waste?


Dangerous waste has one or more of the following properties: toxic, ignitable, corrosive, or reactive.

## How can you get free, hands-on help?

The Pollution Prevention Assistance program offers one-on-one help to businesses.
