



Who we are – Kitsap County Sewer Utility Division

- 4 service areas (Central, Kingston, Manchester, Suquamish).
- 4 treatment plants.
- Over 220 miles of pipeline.
- 65 Lift Stations and growing.
- Staff of roughly 75 full time employees.





What is a General Sewer Plan?

- Required by WAC 173-240-050 and RCW 90.48.110
 - Discuss Treatment Plant operations, regulatory requirements, and operational needs over the planning period 2023-2044.
 - Factor regional growth, and policies to support the County Comprehensive Plan.
 - Provide preliminary information to drive future capital projects with a potential funding strategy.
- The General Plan is reviewed and approved by Department of Ecology and Kitsap County Board of County Commissioners.










Purpose of General Sewer Plan

- Identify current and future system deficiencies
 - $_{\circ}\,$ Capacity constraints due to growth
 - Facility degradation or obsolescence
 - Regulatory requirements
- Create future capital projects funded primarily by utility rates (your sewer bill)
 - $_{\circ}\,$ Projects created at a conceptual level and will evolve once in full design
 - $_{\circ}$ Opportunity for additional public involvement
- Provide the public a complete picture of the Sewer Utility.









Current Financial Strategy

- Mix of bonds and pursuance of grants and low-cost loans
- 6.3% rate increase in 2025 year, 6% each year thereafter



What is SERP?



The State Environmental Review Process (SERP) is a process projects are required to navigate if awarded a water quality program grant or loan from the State.



The process requires review for potential impacts to environmental or cultural resources. Considering social, cultural, economic, and environmental impacts before financing projects that improve water quality.




This plan is a recipient of State Revolving Fund (SRF) money and is required to navigate this process.
