

WRIT OF EXECUTION - PERSONAL PROPERTY - TILL TAP

Need from Plaintiff/Attorney

- 1. Need 3 **certified** copies of the Original Writ. The language within the body of the writ must be specific:
 - a) Define the business or person to be tapped and their location.
 - b) Order that money of the business be seized and turned into the court.
 - c) The Writ should identify the exact equipment to seize the currency from, such as a cash register, safe, lock box, tip jar, etc, though it may be difficult to limit the action to specific equipment types.
 - d) The writ or attorney may direct those multiple attempts be made during the life of the writ to satisfy the judgment.
 - e) If the plaintiff wants break and enter language, we require either a separate Break and Enter Order signed by the judge, or appropriate language in the Order to Issue the Writ signed by the judge and in the Writ.
- 2. Need a copy of the judgment.
- 3. Need a copy of the Order to Issue the Writ, signed by the judge.
- 4. Sheriff's Indemnity Bond: determined on a case-by-case basis.
 - a) Indemnifies the Kitsap County Sheriff.
 - b) Bond is for the Writ of Execution.
 - c) Signed by principal or his agent, and the Attorney in fact.
 - d) Court and cause number.
- 3. Letter of instruction:
 - a) Name and address of defendant (s).
 - b) Address where the currency is located.
- 4. Advance Fees: Determined on a case-by-case basis
