 - O Juan Hernandez (KYSA): we do need a sports complex. 90 kids register just for basketball alone.
 - o Isobel Crump: yes, we need a place for kids but why is Kingston and Kingston Rotary so involved in a facility in Poulsbo? Who is the YMCA going to be used by? Why pull people away from the downtown area?

- **Guest Presentation:** Clint Boxman of Kingston-North Kitsap Rotary presentation on a proposed sports and recreation complex project
 - Rotary surveys the community to identify both small and big needs that they can help to address.
 - The need for fields originally came up in 2013 (or was it 2003)?
 - Don't think about it as a sports complex, think about it as a multigenerational recreation complex

- Turf (artificial) and lighted fields would help
- o Indoor sports areas would be beneficial
- o 80% of the current athletic fields are NKSD fields
- o Rentals for parties, team building, camps, etc
- Grander ideas include:
 - Swimming pool
 - Splash pad
 - Arts & theater center is possible?
- GMA / Land Use (see NKU document)
 - Their analysis indicates it does meet GMA
 - RR (1 DW / 5 acres) is consistent with rural zoning

- Carl Compton: when and where is the next KPTOS (answer: 1st Tuesdays), need is clear, personal pet peeve is need for a cut and cover tunnel (not a business loss), water awareness would benefit from signage.
- O Doc Mary Sullivan: we need a public access pool in NK
- Bruce/Brooks McCain (Suquamish): nothing in presentation about PERC (Poulsbo), we need more cooperation between this project and Poulsbo's project to get the best result.
 - Clint clarified that the plans are only for 2 turf fields (primarily soccer)
- No name: are there any other locations being looked at?
 - Clint says that they are still looking for possible locations. There are 3-4 other properties they've looked at but none of those are Plan A.
- No name: two issues (needs / location) are coupled.
- Alan Chessman: how much space is being proposed for the sports complex?
 - Clint: 20 acres
- Walt Elliott: there is a lot of synergy when you aggregate into a complex instead of separate
- O Suti Arman (sp): we need to think about wildlife, etc.
- O Bill Beaudoin: I appreciate the need, also what Poulsbo is doing includes 2 tournament size fields, we need a feasibility study.
