To Write-In: A name **NOT** on the ballot, connect the arrow and write in the name of the candidate and the party affiliation in the space provided.




Proposed by Initiative Petition: Initiative to the People 872

Initiative Measure No. 872 concerns elections for partisan offices. This measure would allow voters to select among all candidates in a primary. Ballots would indicate candidates' party preference. The two candidates receiving most votes advance to the general election, regardless of party. Should this measure be enacted into law?




Proposed by Initiative Petition: Initiative to the People 884

Initiative Measure No. 884 concerns dedicating funds designated for educational purposes. This measure would create an education trust fund for smaller classes, extended learning programs, certain salary increases, preschool access, and expanded college enrollments and scholarships, funded by increasing retail sales tax by 1%. Proposed by Initiative Petition: Initiative to the People 892

Initiative Measure No. 892 concerns authorizing additional "electronic scratch ticket machines" to reduce property taxes. This measure would authorize licensed non-tribal gambling establishments to operate the same type and number of machines as tribal governments, with a portion of tax revenue generated used to reduce state property taxes. Passed by the Legislature and Ordered Referred by Petition: Referendum Measure 55



Proposed Charter Amendment


