Shoreline Management Act of 1971

 RCW 90.58.080(4) Periodic review of Shoreline Master Program is required under the Shoreline Management Act every eight years

Kitsap County Shoreline Master Program

- Policies and regulations that guide development of the County's shoreline
- Last comprehensive update completed in 2014, after 5-year process

Kitsap County Shoreline Master Program Periodic Review

- Periodic review **Due June 30, 2021**
- Impacts all unincorporated areas of Kitsap County in the Shoreline Jurisdiction

Purpose of a Shoreline Master Program Periodic Review

01

Align the SMP with applicable state laws and guidelines in effect at the time of the review;

02

Assure consistency of the SMP with the County's comprehensive plan and development regulations; and


03

Provide clarifications to improve usability and predictability of the SMP for applicants and reviewers.

The periodic review process:

- does not include review of ecological functions and baseline conditions
- does not include changes to shoreline jurisdiction or environmental designations
- <u>does not</u> include changes to shoreline maps

SEPA Review and Appeal Period

- The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) review process is a Washington State requirement to ensure state and local governments consider the environmental impacts of proposals before taking action.
- A **SEPA Environmental Checklist** is used to determine whether the environmental impacts of proposed amendments are significant.
- A **Determination of Nonsignificance** for proposed code amendments related to Kitsap County's Shoreline Master Program periodic review has been issued under WAC 197-11-340(2) on February 18. The lead agency will not act on this proposal for 14 days.
- The SEPA Review period will close Thursday, March 4, at 5 p.m.
