MAKING HOMELESSNESS RARE –

Goal: Reduce the number of people who are newly homeless through targeted eviction prevention and short-term rental assistance.

MAKING HOMELESSNESS ONE-TIME –

Goal: Decrease the number of returns to homelessness and increase the number of exits to stable housing through placements into Permanent Housing and Permanent Supportive Housing, and connection with employment and education.

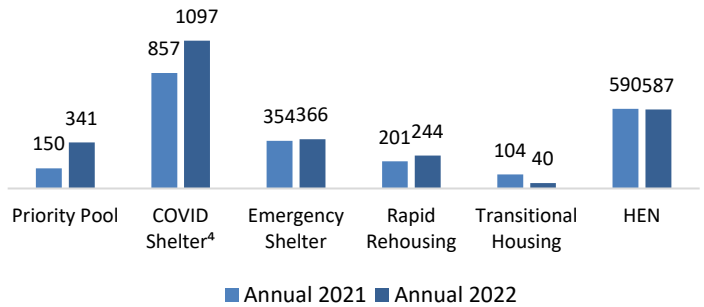

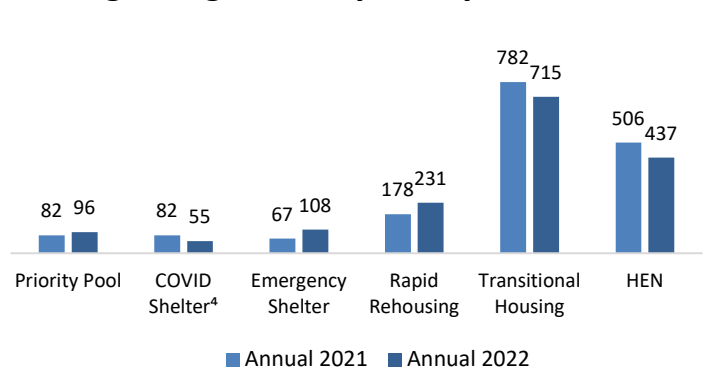
MAKING HOMELESSNESS BRIEF –

Goal: Get people sheltered as quickly as possible and reduce the number of days spent in emergency shelter, transitional housing, rapid rehousing, or on a wait list.

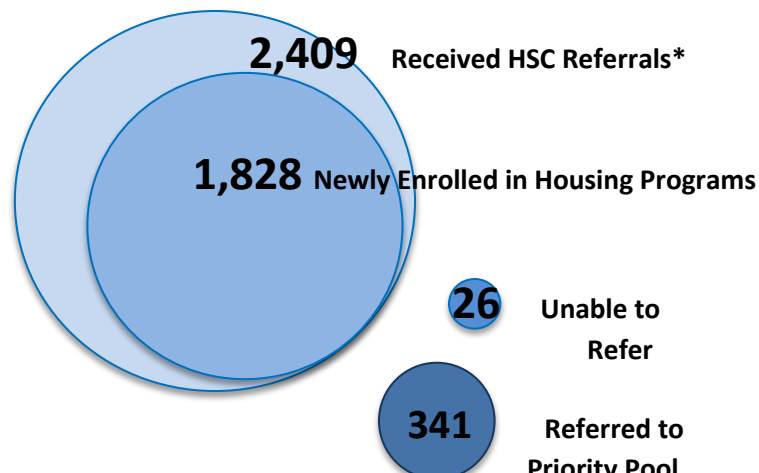
Number of Households Housed
