Capital Projects Program

Fairgrounds and Events Center Staff have prepared a Request for Qualifications document in looking for Architectural services in order to re-design the deck attached to the Eagle's Nest building. The deck is not currently functional due to instability issues and safety concerns. The plan is to rebuild the deck within the same footprint.

Norwegian Point Park

Several years ago, Parks planning staff had worked with a consultant to design a pier/dock at the park. Due to COVID and staff turnover, the project has been relatively dormant since 2019. During this time, Wild Fish Conservancy has been working on a restoration project to re-route Finn Creek in the park from a ditch into a more natural meandering estuary. Planning staff have been coordinating with Wild Fish Conservancy to integrate the two efforts together into one project to ensure they function and complement each other and to streamline the permitting process.

Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park – ride park and parking lots

The mountain bike ride park is approximately 70% complete. Work has stopped for the dry summer months but will resume in the fall with the return of the rains and moisture. Completion for the ride park is targeted for the end of the year.

The SDAP permit for the Stottlemeyer parking lot and trailhead remains in DCD's review process.

The SDAP permit for the ride park parking lot and trailhead have been submitted to DCD.

Events and Facilities Rental Program

Staffing Challenges

The Events team has been experiencing some turnover in the past couple of months and has been working through other approved leave. To help offset the loss of supervisory staff, the Parks Director has taken on primary communications with Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association for Fair preparations and is providing oversight to other program operations.

Events and Rentals

As of August 1, the fairgrounds have largely been handed over to the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association (KFSA) for County Fair preparations. Parks staff are assisting with grounds and facility preparations.

The new gate was installed in mid-August and new remote openers have been distributed to the residents who live along the road.

Kitsap County Fairgrounds & Events Center

Parks staff are gearing up grounds and facility maintenance in preparation for the upcoming Kitsap County Fair! Activities include vegetation management, hazard tree removal, rental equipment repairs, and facility cleaning.

Island Lake Park

Parks M&O staff are working with the County's purchasing department to hire a contractor to initiate repairs to the fishing pier that was lit on fire last year.

Homeless Response

Parks has experienced a slight increase in overnight use of parks by community members experiencing homelessness, some living out of their vehicles. Parks has been working with the HEART team to respond to this at Island Lake Park, Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park, Banner Forest Heritage Park, Veteran's Memorial Park, Old Mill Park, and at the Fairgrounds.

Forest Stewardship Program

Square Lake Park

- Ecologically based selective thinning at Square Lake is nearing completion. Tree removal has finished but hauling the timber off site is still underway. Completion is expected by the end of August.
- The gate staff had erected at the project site off of Lake Flora Road was recently stolen.

Wicks Lake

• Ecologically based selective thinning is scheduled to begin in September.

Forest Inventory Plotting

 Natural Resources staff, with volunteers who attended the Forest Stewardship training, are conducting inventories at Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park, Banner Forest Heritage Park, South Kitsap Regional Park, and Newberry Hill Heritage Park. The plots will be tracked over the coming years to identify changes in the forest.

Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park

- Installation of a new footbridge across a creek and construction of turnpikes with help from Youth Build is in progress.

• Invasive weed removal and beauty bark spread in park.

- Installation of an ADA accessible trail from the parking lot to the apple orchard is nearing completion. This work is getting done with students from South Kitsap High School's Club Interact program and supported by Port Orchard Rotary.
- Fencing in the dog park erected to prevent dogs and foot traffic from entering the stream bed.

- Washington Trail Alliance performed trail work to fix drainage issues and they installed stairs to prevent erosion.

Planning Program

Staffing

Aaron Nix was hired on July 18, 2022 and began absorbing as much information and background on Kitsap County Parks and Open Space resources.

PROS Plan

Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (PROS) plans are required to be updated every six years to be eligible for grant opportunities with the State's Recreation and Conservation

Office. Additionally, the PROS plan will help Kitsap County achieve the Open Space and Recreation goal of the Growth Management Act. PROS plans are purposed with developing goals and objectives to meet current community demands and position the department to meet future and projected needs. Kitsap County Parks will be engaging in this work in 2023, the current plan expires in March 2024. In preparation for this, staff has begun to update and catalog the Parks department's inventory of land and assets into a database so current status of facilities and conditions can provide a starting baseline.

Point No Point Park

Staff is aiding the Natural Resources team with the permitting process to remove a beaver dam along the channeled outflow that runs through the park. Flooding concerns stemming from the beaver dam were raised by Public Works. SEPA, a Shoreline Exemption and WDFW hydraulics permit will be required to remove the structure. Permits are approximately a month out before the work can occur.

Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park - framework

The original draft framework was posted on the project website on February 28, 2022 for public review and comment. Since then, it has been presented/shared with stakeholders, Tribes, focus groups, the Parks Advisory Board, and the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) to answer questions and receive comments. On July 11, 2022 the framework, comments, and an "FAQ" document was presented to the BoCC as an official public hearing. This same information was shared with the Parks Advisory Board (PAB) on July 20, 2020. The feedback collected from these collective efforts guided edits to the framework which was presented to the BoCC on August 8, 2022 and shared publicly on August 10, 2022. Due to comments received from the community, the need to conduct a non-project SEPA (State Environment Protection ACT) review is under consideration.
