



## **SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION BULLETIN** **LEVEL 3 NOTIFICATION**

### **SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION DETAIL**

December 19, 2018

The *KITSAP COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE* is releasing the following information pursuant to RCW 4.24.550 and the Washington State Supreme Court decision in State v. Ward, which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offenders release when; in the discretion of the agency, the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the sheriff's office in the county of their residence. Further, their previous criminal history places them in a classification level which reflects the potential to re-offend.

This sex offender has served the sentence imposed on him by the courts and has advised the *KITSAP County Sheriff's Department* that he/she will be living in the location below. HE/SHE IS NOT WANTED BY THE POLICE AT THIS TIME. THIS NOTIFICATION IS NOT INTENDED TO INCREASE FEAR; RATHER, IT IS OUR BELIEF THAT AN INFORMED PUBLIC IS A SAFER PUBLIC.

The *KITSAP COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE* has no legal authority to direct where a sex offender may or may not live. Unless court ordered restrictions exist, this offender is constitutionally free to live wherever he chooses.

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities; but it wasn't until passage of the Community Protection Act of 1990 (which mandates sex offender registration) that law enforcement even knew where they were living. In many cases, law enforcement is now able to share that information with you. Citizen abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate or harass registered sex offenders will not be tolerated. Further, such abuse could potentially end law enforcement's ability to do community notifications. We believe the only person who wins if community notification ends is the sex offender, since sex offenders derive their power through secrecy.

Subject: Michael Dale Loyle, white male, age 63, height: 5' 06", weight: 180 lbs., hair: brown, eyes: hazel. Loyle will be residing in the 17000 block of Viking Way NW, Poulsbo, within Kitsap County.

#### **CRIMINAL HISTORY: According to official court documents –**

Loyle was convicted of communication with a minor for immoral purposes in June 1984 after exposing himself to two juvenile females who were not known to him behind the apartment building where the females were living. In September 1992, Loyle was convicted of indecent exposure for making suggestive motions towards three juvenile females that were not known to him. In October 1993, Loyle was convicted of rape of a child, 1<sup>st</sup> degree, after sexually assaulting a juvenile female known to him. Early in

Loyle's incarceration for his conviction in 1993, Loyle received several infractions for sexually inappropriate behavior and refusing to follow staff directives. It was noted that over the last several years while Loyle has been at the Special Commitment Center, McNeil Island, he has been compliant with institutional rules and has shown a high degree of effort and motivation to participate and contribute to the group effort of treatment.
